



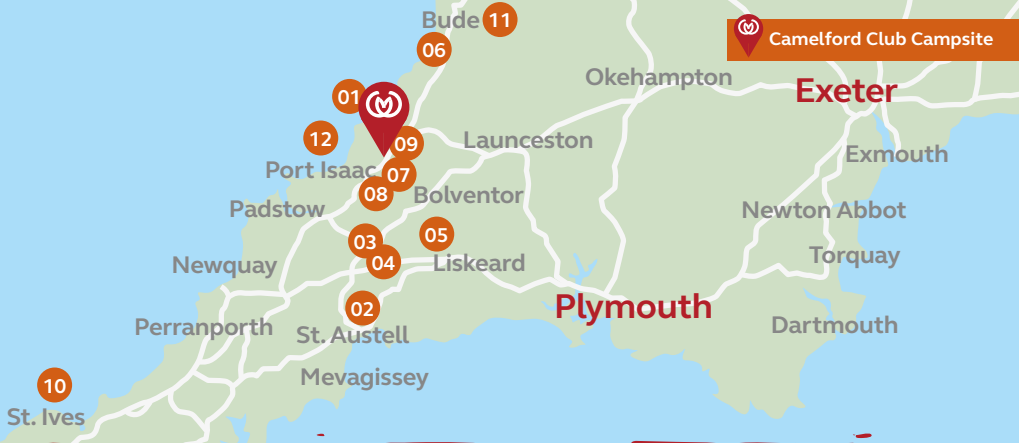

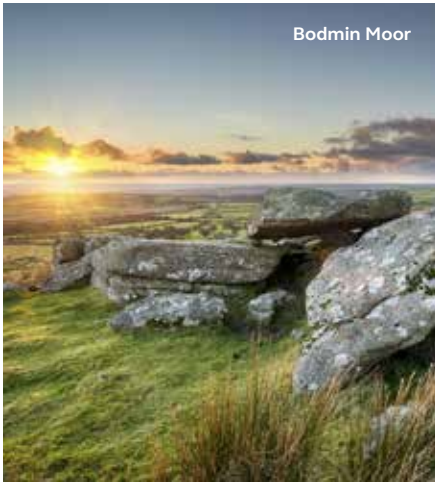

7 Local routes

There's various walks in the local area, and the Bodmin Moor Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty is close by as well as the South West Coastal Path.

Adorned by golden beaches, pretty cobbled streets and luscious flora.

11 Bude

Voted as the UK's Best Coastal Resort, this laid-back and charming town has something for everyone.

12 Port Isaac

Set amidst rolling hilltops and rugged coast, this is a truly picturesque village.

8 Camel Trail

The Camel Trail, an 18 mile mainly level route through beautiful Cornish countryside, is just 6 miles away.

9 National Cycle Network

The nearest route to the site is 3, Bristol to Lands End.

Visitor's top tips

Walk the coast path. Whilst we were there we walked from Hartland Quay in Devon to Newquay and it was some of the finest coastal scenery in the UK.

Visit Port Isaac, now famous as the home of TV's Doc Martin.

Boscastle, Padstow and Tintagel, steeped in the legend of King Arthur, all very close by and lovely to explore.

If you visit during the summer, lots of local places have carnival weeks with lots events to join in with.

If you have time, visit Exeter or Plymouth, both around an hour's drive away, offering great shopping, historic sites, beautiful scenery and lots to do.

At Boscastle, try the cream tea in the cafe.

Golfing at Bowood Park is fantastic, located just down the road from site.

The Mason's Arms Pub serves excellent food and is dog-friendly.

The beaches in Harlyn and Widemouth Bay are absolutely beautiful.

Bodmin Jail is definitely a must-see, steeped in hundreds of years of history.

We really enjoyed the food from the on site fish & chip van – great portion sizes too!

Tintagel Castle is a fantastic English Heritage site, with stunning sea views.
