



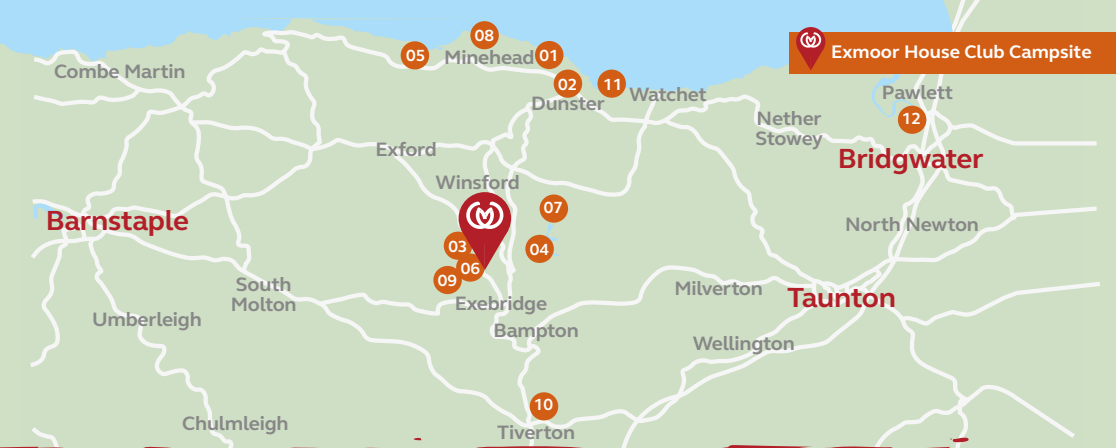

6 Local routes

A good walking route is through Burridge Woods.

7 Exe Valley Way

A mix of canal towpath, quiet country lanes, fields, woodlands and open moorland.

8 South West Coast Path

Discover some of the 630 miles of incredible coastline which makes up the longest National Trail in the UK .

The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is route number 3, Taunton to Hatherleigh, part of the West Country Way.

10 Tiverton

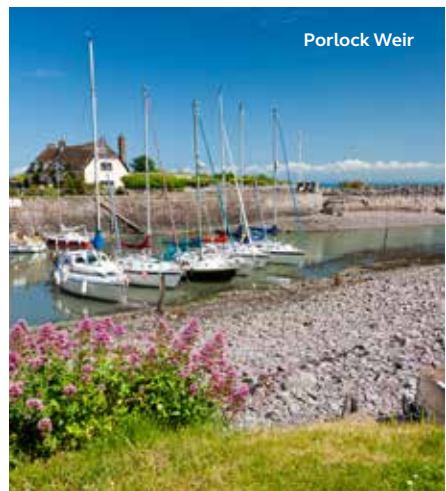
Step back to a simpler time, with romantic castles, historic houses, and horse drawn barges.

11 Porlock Weir

A small, pretty village built around the harbour at the end of Porlock Bay.

12 Bridgwater

This historic town is home to a breath-taking National Nature Reserve Bay.





Visitor's top tips

Try Barle Valley Safaris and discover seldom frequented tracks and ancient byways by Land Rover.

There's a beautiful walk from Withypool to Tarr Steps, an ancient clapper bridge.

The local guided walking tour is £3.00 per person for a 2 hour walk – excellent value and really interesting.

Pine Lodge stables is only a mile away to take in the beauty of the area & if you're lucky you'll see red deer.

Try the Tongdam Thai Restaurant in Dulverton, the food is delicious.


The National Trust's Knightshayes Country Estate is glorious, a must-see.

Dulverton is so dog-friendly, with dogs practically allowed in every shop.

This area is a walkers dream, with incredibly scenic trails for all abilities.

The fish & chip shop in Dulverton is great and the local delicatessen is lovely for homemade cakes, bread and pies.

The Dulverton Model Railway Exhibition is great for the kids!

The closest pub to site is the Bridge Inn, which is dog-friendly and serves excellent food with lovely service.
