

Visit

Wookey Hole

Caves, gardens, Victorian penny arcade, shows and family attractions.

2 Clevedon Pier

The only fully intact, beautifully restored Grade 1 listed pier in the county.

3 Cheddar Gorge and Caves

Limestone cliffs towering above the gorge, and beautifully lit caves of stalactites and stalagmites.

4 Glastonbury Abbey

The legendary burial place of King Arthur, with romantic ruins and peaceful parkland for walks.

5 The Walled Gardens of Cannington

Within the grounds of a medieval priory, with many fine buildings remaining.

6 Animal Farm Adventure Park

Hand feed and hold many animals at this adventure park set in 23 acres of Somerset countryside, with views to the Mendip Hills.





Walk

7 Berrow Beach

Enjoy walks from Berrow beach, just a 15 minute walk from the site. You can also see the wreck of the 1897 Norwegian barque SS Nornen which ran aground here.

Cycle

B Wessex Way

The Wessex Way cycle route starts from nearby Bridgewater.

9 Strawberry Line

A 10 mile traffic free cycle way offering views over the Somerset levels, from Cheddar to Clevedon.

10 Weston-super-Mare


This characterful seaside town is home to a long stretch of pretty beach, a great shopping centre and lovely pier.

1 Bath

A unique city which combines vibrant culture with a rich history.

12 Wells

England's smallest city with a glorious Cathedral and impressive Bishop's Palace in it's medieval centre.



Visitor's top tips

Try the cycling route 33 Brean Down way, it's 8 miles to Weston-Super-Mare.

For shopping fans, Clarks shopping village is only 20 miles away and great for finding a bargain on top brands.

A visit to Brean Down should not be missed. It's well worth walking to the top for the views over Weston- super-Mare and Burnham, and there's a coffee shop at the bottom.

Burnham-on-Sea is a lovely visit for the family, with gorgeous sandy beaches, superb shopping and lots to see and do!

This is a good site for birdwatching on the Somerset Levels.

The West Somerset Steam Railway is a wonderful day out, taking you through the glorious countryside and coast.

We loved that fresh fish & chips were delivered to site on Wednesdays and Fridays – was a nice break from cooking!

There are lots of dog-friendly attractions and places to eat/drink in the area, as well as some fantastic dog walks.

Our favourite National Trust sites included Tyntesfield, Coleridge Cottage and Dunster Castle.

The Helicopter Museum in Weston was very interesting.
