
6 Sea Kayak Devon

8 Local routes

The southern tip of Dartmoor is perfect trekking country – the ground is relatively level and exposed making it suitable for different levels of ability. Climb to the Western Beacon and you'll feel on top of the world!

Cycle

9 Local routes

Follow the Plym Valley cycle trail through woodland and open countryside. The route starts from Marsh Mills roundabout near Plymouth and is suitable for the whole family.

10 National Cycle Network

The nearest National Cycle Network Route 28 runs from Okehampton to Plymouth. You could also follow Route 2 that runs from Dover to St Austell.

Visitor's top tips

We found The Ship Inn in Nos Mayo via the CAMRA Good Beer Guide. Great beer, excellent food and typical Devon 'smuggler's bay' surroundings.

Kingsbridge & Bigbury on Sea, are both excellent days out.

If you enjoy walking, do some of the south coastal paths from Kingston to the Erme estuary, then across the hills. You'll find a route sheet in reception.

The beach at Bigbury is really stunning with views of Burgh Island.

We really enjoyed fish & chips at the Ship Inn in Ughborough.

Salcome is one of the prettiest towns we've ever been to – gorgeous beaches and breath-taking countryside!

There are lots of National Trust and English Heritage sites around – Hope Cove is a real treasure.

The White Hart Pub in Modbury offers excellent food.

Widicombe-in-the-Moor is a lovely little village with incredible surrounding natural beauty.

We stumbled across a wonderful farm shop and cafe in East Charleston named Springfields – highly recommended!
