Scotland's most southerly point, with prehistoric fortifications, bird sanctuary and lighthouse and RSPB visitor centre.

- Castle Kennedy Explore the walled gardens surrounding the castle, tearoom, shop, plant centre and activities.
- **Logan Fish Pond Marine** Life Centre


Ferries daily from Cairnryan which is 35 minutes from site.

One of the best newly created gardens, with Wildflower Walk and views across Luce Bay and the Mull of Galloway.





Visitor's top tips

The beach is sheltered and great for boat launching, swimming, fishing off Myroch Point or just walking the dog and building sandcastles.

The site is excellent for birdwatching and enjoying wildlife. Seals can be seen at various times of the year and the gannets on Big Scare island can be seen plunging into the sea from great heights.

For a special seafood treat visit Connor's Restaurant in Port Patrick or enjoy one of the other harbourside pubs. In this picturesque coastal village, walk up to Dunskey Castle for panoramic views. Don't miss the gardens at Glenwhan, the botanic at Port Logan, Castle Kennedy, Port Patrick and the Galloway lighthouse for spectacular walks.

A fish and chip van visits site twice every week which is a lovely treat!

Be sure to visit to the RSPB reserve at Mull of Galloway.

The Waterfront and the Crown in Portpatrick are both good, especially on days when you can sit outside. The coffee shop at the Mull of Galloway lighthouse is superb; the views are staggering.
