  13th century Cathedral with the tallest spire in the country.
- 2 Stonehenge
  The best known prehistoric monument in Europe.
- 3 Mompesson House
  Built in 1701, a perfect example of elegant Queen Anne architecture.
- 4 Museum of Army Flying
  Interesting exhibits, educational
  tours and a great day out.
- 5 Old Sarum

  The site of the earliest settlement of Salisbury.

## Cycle

### Salisbury

There is limited cycling directly from the site, but Salisbury has several cycle trails to help you explore the city. From Salisbury you can also cycle to Old Sarum and, if you want to go further afield, on to Amesbury and Stonehenge. See www.visitwiltshire.co.uk/salisbury to download a route map.

#### Walk

#### 9 Local routes

There is limited walking directly from the site, but Salisbury has several walks and the Test Valley Way from Stockbridge is enjoyable. These are available from the information room.

#### 10 Clarendon Way

The Clarendon Way runs from Salisbury to Winchester. It gets its name from Clarendon Park on the eastern edge of Salisbury.




## **Explore**

#### Winchester

From world-class attractions and architecture, excellent shopping and dining, to countryside trails for walking and cycling, there's plenty to do in and around Winchester.

#### 13 Salisbury Museum

Situated in the medieval King's House, the museum has fantastic collections, events and exhibitions year round.





## Visitor's top tips

The Museum of Army Flying has a café with a veranda where you can watch helicopters taking off and landing.

Walk up Danebury Hillfort, the views are spectacular and it's brilliant for dog walking.

For delicious cheeses, Artisan breads and fresh local products visit Salisbury Charter Market on Tuesdays and Saturdays.

Go for afternoon tea in the Cathedral, it is lovely.

The walking tour of Salisbury from the Information Centre gives an excellent overview of the city.

Stonehenge is within driving distance and is a must see.

We enjoyed lots of trips out including Stourhead, Bowood House and Gardens, Old Sarum, Houghton Lodge Gardens, Great Chatfield Manor and Gardens, Old Wardour Castle.

The sculpture park in East Winterslow is well-worth a visit.

Towards Andover there is a local petrol station 2.6 miles or a Murco 4.2 miles from site. Towards Salisbury there is a BP 6.8 miles from site.

There is a cashpoint either at Asda 9 miles away or at BP 6.8 miles from site.

#### **Public transport**

There is a limited bus service 2 minutes from the site, to Salisbury.
