1 The Bowes Museum

A collection of European arts, acclaimed exhibitions, special events and children's activities.

2 Barnard Castle

Walk to the town, where you'll find plenty of shops, pubs and restaurants and the impressive castle ruins.

3 Locomotion, Shildon

At Locomotion you can see highlights of the national collection of railway vehicles in the world's first railway town.

4 Raby Castle

Set in the heart of the Durham Dales with deer park and gardens.

There are many excellent local walks, including across the river to Barnard Castle. Teesdale offers superb walking, and the Pennine Way passes through Middleton.

## 11 Darlington

A modern market town with a lovely town centre which offers a great range of shops and cafés, as well as a gorgeous Victorian park.

This beautiful, vibrant town is steeped in rich heritage with an impressive castle keep, cobbled marketplace and elegant Georgian district.





# Visitor's top tips

Visit to Bowlees Visitor Centre from where it's an easy walk to High Force and Low Force.

The City of Durham is steeped in history and the walk up to and around the Cathedral is inspiring.

Visit the Fox & Hounds at Cotherstone for a very good meal with excellent choice of ale.

Barnard Castle Ramblers produce a walks book, which is excellent value at £2.50 from local newsagents.

Penny's Tea Shop is a fantastic dogfriendly cafe in Barnard Castle.

The market in Barnard Castle is lovely, and Moments Cafe offers a wonderful selection of vegetarian food.

The Bowes Museum is a great visit in Barnard Castle, as is the Locomotion Railway Museum in Shildon.

There are some superb woodland dog walks from site – we particularly loved the forest walk to Barnard Castle.

Hannah's Meadow Nature Reserve is absolutely stunning.
