River Breamish Caravan Club Site

As part of The Club's ongoing commitment to protecting and enhancing the natural environment on and around Club Sites, our Boosting Biodiversity programme aims to help members and Wardens get more from their surroundings. A rolling ecological appraisal of sites across The Club network, as part of the Boosting Biodiversity initiative, has included this site.

The Caravan Club is also implementing a Corporate Biodiversity Action Plan (CBAP), which sets objectives and actions for the conservation of biodiversity across the Sites network, and makes recommendations for encouraging and managing 20 species and habitats. You can play a part in our commitment to the environment, by using this Boosting Biodiversity Checklist to monitor the wildlife you see during your stay. Your findings will be invaluable in ensuring our sites maintain as diverse a habitat for wildlife as is practically possible, and will be included in the overall results collated as part of our CBAP obligations. We would also welcome records of additional species not included on the form, so space has been provided for these.

This site was a former sand extraction pit and now includes a wonderfully diverse habitat including grassland, broad-leaved woodland, wet woodland, a small lake and a river. The wet woodland, woodland and open water are Biodiversity Action Plan Priority habitats. The bird life is of particular interest. The River Breamish, which forms the site boundary, is part of the Tweed catchment rivers Site of Special Scientific Interest and notable for aquatic plant communities, salmon, trout, lamprey and most excitingly, the otter.
