- **Tredegar House and Park**

Set in a beautiful 90-acre park, Tredegar House is one of the best examples of a 17th Century, Charles II mansion in Britain. The earliest surviving part of the building dates back to the early 1500s.

- **Caerleon Roman Fortress & Baths**

The site of the 50-acre (20.3ha) Roman legionary fortress of Isca, the permanent base of the Second Augustan Legion in Britain from about AD75. Impressive remains of the fortress baths, amphitheatre, barracks, and fortress wall.

Get to know your site

This 7-acre site offers 79 spacious pitches, is ideally located within a mile of the M4 motorway and only 7 miles from Cardiff. Tredegar House is fairly described as one of the architectural wonders of Wales, and recognised as one of the most significant 17th c. houses in the British Isles.

The beautiful park, with its ornamental lakes, 17th c. orangery and garden, woodland, walled gardens and adventure

playground opens throughout the year.

If you can tear yourself away, try to devote at least one day to exploring Cardiff with its Castle, National Museum, Bay Development and excellent shopping centre. Other notable visits in the area include Newport's restored Transporter Bridge, Pwll Mawr (Big Pit mining museum), Roman Caerleon and the beautiful Wye Valley and the Museum of Welsh life at St Fagans.

Reception services

Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board outside the reception.

Site shop

Open at the same times as reception. The shop sells Gas, Aqua Kem, Aqua Rinse, rock pegs, postcards, ice cream, sweets and chocolate, cold drinks and washing powder. Newspapers can be bought at the Post Office just outside the grounds of Tredegar Park.

Information room

Open at the same times as reception. Leaflets are available about the many attractions and places of interest that you can visit during your stay.

Mobile & public telephones

Mobile phone reception is poor on all networks. There is a public telephone located next to reception. Please note that this phone does not accept incoming calls.

Pitches

Pitch care

Please lift awning ground sheets daily. No plastic ground sheets are allowed.

Motorhomes

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motorhome sign on display.

Vacating your pitch

If you wish to stay after 12 noon on your day of departure, it is normally not a problem unless the site is fully booked. Please ask at Reception before 10am on your day of departure.

Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

TV reception

In order to watch television on site you will need an Integrated Digital TV (IDTV) or a digital receiver, and you may also need an

The costs of electricity are included in your pitch fee, but please help us minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. Also any saving could help to reduce pitch fees or help towards investments in new sites or redevelopments.

Toilets and showers

Cleaning times are displayed on the toilet block doors.

There are two separate toilets open while cleaning is in progress.

There is a baby and toddler bathroom for children under four years old. A digital code is required for all blocks. The disabled toilet and shower facilities are behind the Ladies toilets and a RADAR key is required.

Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are: Washing machine £4.00, Tumble drier £1.00, Rinse & Spin £1.00 per 15min cycle. Washing sinks are also available. Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences.

Ball games

Ball games may be played in the Country Park but not on site.

Safety on site

Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not.

Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead at all times on site. Please do not walk your dog on grassed areas or over pitches. There is no dog walk on site. Dogs must be walked in the Country Park outside the site entrance.

Fire point

(to activate alarm/warning) Located at all service points and Reception. The fire assembly point is shown on the Site map.

Security barrier

There is a security barrier on site that is card operated. Please do not walk under the barriers.

Park gates

The site is located within Tredegar Country Park and a key is needed for access through the Park gates after 8.00pm or dusk, whichever is earlier. Please ask the Warden as the Park gate times may change.

Visitors

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at reception when arriving on site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please

meet them at reception and make sure they can exit after the National Trust gates are locked. Visitor cars must be parked in the car park.
