Local attractions

• Exmoor National Park

Stunning landscapes, wilderness and a warm rural welcome awaits you on Exmoor, one of Britain's hidden treasures. This, and a glimpse of wild red deer or the native Exmoor Pony are just some of the delights that make Exmoor special. There are three Visitor Centres in the region.

• Knightshayes Court

This house was built in c1870 by William Burges. The celebrated garden features a water lily pool, topiary, fine specimen trees, formal terraces, spring bulbs and rare shrubs.

• Wimbleball Lake

A scenic Exmoor lake offering sailing, rowing, wind surfing, angling, walking, tearooms and play area in stunning countryside near Dulverton.

• Coldharbour Mill Museum

See wool processing on 19th Century machines in a Georgian spinning mill. Also a working water wheel and beam and horizontal steam engines, which are steamed on special event days.

• Tarr Steps Woodland National Nature Reserve

Tarr Steps is an example of a 'clapper' bridge (the term being derived from the Latin 'claperius', meaning 'pile of stones') and is constructed entirely from large stone slabs and boulders.

Activities

• Cycling

The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is Bristol to Lands End, Route 3, OS ref SS935260.

• Walking

A footpath leads to the village pub and local transport from the bottom of the site (wellies will be needed in wet weather!) Exmoor National Park is just a mile away, with 700 miles of footpaths and bridleways, and the coast is only a short drive away. Local beauty spots include Tarr Steps, Dunkery Beacon, Winsford and the 'Doone Valley'.

• Fishing

Coarse fishing in the lake adjacent to the site is courtesy of Tiverton Angling Club. Permits can be purchased from the site office between 9am and 5pm.

Fly Fishing also available in the village.

Get to know your site

This site has splendid facilities and all pitches (now level) boast superb views of surrounding hills and the Exe Valley. There is a path alongside the fishing lake to The Anchor pub some 400 yards away. Dulverton is a quiet town 3 miles away within the National Park. For keen anglers, Wimbleball Lake is only a few miles away and there is coarse and fly-fishing at Exbridge.

This site makes an excellent base from which to explore the spectacular coastline and sandy beaches of North Devon, all of which are within easy reach.

Bathing off the coast can be dangerous and particular note must be taken of any local notices.

Reception services

Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board outside reception.

Site shop

Open at the same times as reception. The shop sells toilet chemicals, Gas, milk, eggs, ice cream, walks and maps.

Information room

Open 24 hours. Leaflets are available about the many attractions and places of interest that you can visit during your stay.

Mobile telephones

Some networks have limited or very poor reception.

Wi-Fi

Wi-fi internet access is available on this site. Please ask the Warden for details.

Pitches

Pitch care

Please lift awning ground sheets daily.

Motorhomes

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motorhome sign on display.

Vacating your pitch

If you wish to stay after 12 noon on your day of departure, please ask at reception.

Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

Serviced pitches

These pitches have an all-weather surface and usually an individual ground level inlet for grey water. Further shared facilities include an illuminated EHU bollard and drinking water.

TV reception

As part of the Digital Switchover, this region has now had its analogue television signal switched off. In order to watch television on site you will need an Integrated Digital TV (IDTV) or a digital receiver, and you may also need an aerial or satellite dish. Electric hook-up

The costs of electricity are included in your pitch fee, but please help us minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. Also any saving could help to reduce pitch fees or help towards investments in new sites or redevelopments.

Toilets and showers

The toilet block is closed for cleaning at the following times:
10.30am to 12 noon.

There is a baby and toddler bathroom for children under 4 years old. Please ensure that children are supervised by an adult at all times.

A RADAR key is available from reception for the disabled toilet and shower facilities.

Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are:

Washing machine £4.00, Tumble drier £1.00, Rinse & Spin £1.00 per 15min cycle. Washing sinks are also available. Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences.

Recycling facilities

On site for all recyclable items.

Play areas

All ball games to be played on the play field please, not around caravans.

Games room

There is a Games Room on site, please see notice on the door for opening times.

Safety on site

Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead not exceeding 3 metres at all times whilst on site and adjoining fields, and clean up after them. There is a large dog walk through the gate at the far end of the site where they may be exercised off the lead.

Fire point

(to activate alarm/warning) Located at all service points. The fire assembly point is in the pitching area as shown on the Site map.

Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not.

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at reception.

The closest are the Co-op in Dulverton and Morrisons and Tesco in Tiverton.

There is a riverside pub within 5 min's walk.

In Tiverton, 12 miles away.

Swimming pool

At Mid Devon Leisure Centre in Tiverton.

In Dulverton (3 miles).

Public transport

There is a limited bus service from the village.

Places of worship

C of E, Catholic and Methodist churches are in the local area.
