## Get to know your site

This large site has over 200 pitches yet nonetheless feels peaceful, with the beautiful Malvern Hills to explore. Historic Great Malvern is an ideal touring centre in its own right.

Malvern is proud of its famous adopted son and the Elgar Trail takes in his birthplace at Broadheath to his final nursing home in Worcester. Renowned for its pure Spring Water, Malvern also hosts a lively Festival and Fringe each

May and has a Priory described as the finest parish church in England.

You can visit Worcester for its Cathedral; Upton-upon-Severn for the pubs and Jazz Festival in June; Bromyard for its Folk Festival in August and Ledbury for its fine black & white buildings.

Don't miss the Cathedral at Hereford with its ancient Mappa Mundi, & the excellent Cider Museum, which tells how the drink is made.

# General site information

## Reception services

### On site and telephone reservations

Available during office hours:  
Summer 9.00am - 6.00pm;  
Spring & Autumn - 9.00am - 5.00pm.

### Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board outside the office.

### Site shop

Open at the same times as reception. The shop sells milk, gas, ice cream and newspapers to order. There is a small library where books may be exchanged.

### Information room

Open 24 hours. Leaflets are available about the many attractions and places of interest that you can visit during your stay.

### Mobile telephones

Mobiles can be used on site but some networks have better reception.

## Pitches

### Pitch care

Steel awning pegs are required on this site. Please only use breathable awning ground sheets and lift them daily.

### Motorhomes

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motorhome sign on display.

### Vacating your pitch

Pitches should normally be vacated by 12 noon on your day of departure. However, it may not be a problem for you to stay later if your pitch is not needed. Please check with the Warden.

### Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

### TV reception

Television reception is fair, best with a digital aerial vertical. The EHU bollards do not have a TV socket.

### Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi internet access is available on this site.

### Electric hook-up

The costs of electricity are included in your pitch fee, but please help us minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. Also any saving could help to reduce pitch fees or help towards investments in new sites or redevelopments.

## Site facilities

Please see the Site map for locations of amenity blocks.

### Toilets and showers

The toilet blocks are closed for cleaning at the times shown outside the block doors. Disabled toilet and shower facilities are located in both blocks operated by a RADAR key.

### Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are:  
Washing machine £4.00, Tumble drier £1.00, Rinse & Spin £1.00 per 15min cycle. Washing sinks are available. Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences.

### Recycling

Recyclable Waste, Glass and General Waste are situated at both Toilet Blocks.

## Safety on site

### Pets

Please keep your pet on a lead at all times on the pitching areas and roads within the site, and clean up after them. There is a Dog Walk at the bottom of the site. There are a number of public commons in the area.

### Fire points

Fire Bells are located at all service points and Red Fire boxes are situated around the site.

### Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not.

### Visitors

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at reception.

The closest is the Co-op in Barnards Green, about 3 miles from the site.

There is a bus service ¼ mile towards the village to Worcester, Tewkesbury and Upton. Malvern can be accessed from the village of Hanley Swan or Upton. Buses do not run on Sundays.
