

A Cycle Ride from Hurn Lane Club Site

This circular route has been suggested by Sustrans' Volunteer Rangers. Sustrans is the UK's leading sustainable transport charity and is responsible for the development of the 12,000 miles of National Cycle Network. We hope you will enjoy exploring the local area near the Site and make the most of your stay at Hurn Lane.

The route takes in part of National Route 33 of the National Cycle Network which starts at Pill, just outside Bristol, and runs down the coast to Clevedon and Weston-super-Mare then on to Bridgwater, Chard and Seaton. It is known as the Wessex Cycleway.



The Route

- 1 Head north from The Club Site along Red Road.
- 2 Branch right on to Wick Road passing Wick Farm.
- 3 Turn right just before the railway bridge along Wick Lane, crossing the railway along the way.
- 4 Turn left along the B3140 where you can clearly see Brent Knoll fort.
- 5 Another left turn brings you on to West Road.
- 6 A good place to stop for a picnic is in Lymphsham, beside the school or church. Turn left heading out of Lymphsham.
- 7 Turn left to railway crossing, and follow the beginning of the route in reverse back to the Club Site.



The Route

Starting point: **Hurn Lane Caravan Club Site**

End point: **Hurn Lane Caravan Club Site**

Distance: **10 miles**

Grade: **Easy**

Surface: **Tarmac**

Traffic: **Very light**

Suitability for young children: **YES**

Hills: **No – flat route**

Refreshments/facilities: **Shops on route**

Nearest railway station(s): **Burnham-on-Sea – 4 miles**

Other routes in the area:

National Route 26 – The Strawberry Line is close by, between Yatton and Cheddar on a disused railway line
