

A Cycle Ride from Lleithyr Meadow Club Site

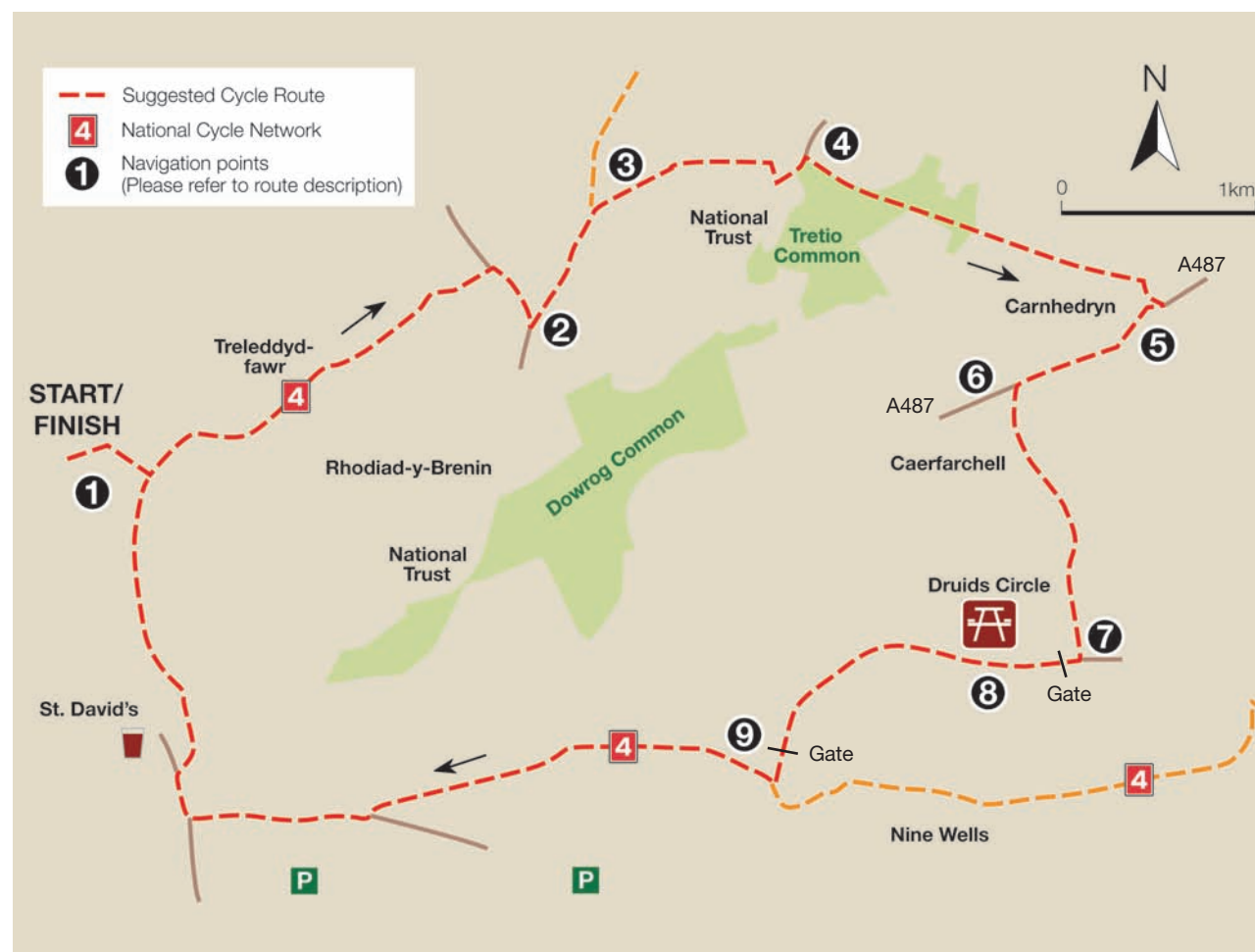
This circular route has been suggested by Sustrans' Volunteer Rangers. Sustrans is the UK's leading sustainable transport charity and is responsible for the development of the 12,000 miles of National Cycle Network. We hope you will enjoy exploring the local area near the Site and make the most of your stay at Lleithyr Meadow.

This route takes in part of National Route 4 of the National Cycle Network, which runs from London to St David's. The ride starts at the Club Site and passes through Tretio Common, Caerfachell and The Druids Circle.



The Route

- 1** Turn left out of the Club Site and then left again on to National Cycle Network Route 4 following the blue signs.
- 2** Turn left at the T-junction and continue for just over half a mile on the B4583.
- 3** Turn right on to an un-signposted road, passing a field with a standing stone.
- 4** Turn right at the next junction and continue on the road passing through Tretio Common.
- 5** Take great care turning right on to the A487.
- 6** Continue on the A487 for half a mile and then turn left towards Caerfachell.
- 7** At the top of the hill where the road turns left sharply, take the bridleway on the old perimeter track of St. David's airfield.
- 8** The Druids Circle is clearly visible, and is a good place to stop for a picnic. Continue on the perimeter track.
- 9** Turn right rejoining National Route 4 into St. David's and back to the Club Site.



The Route

Starting point: **Lleithyr Meadow Caravan Club Site**

End point: **Lleithyr Meadow Caravan Club Site**

Distance: **11 miles**

Grade: **Easy**

Surface: **Tarmac**

Traffic: **Light traffic**

Suitability for young children: **YES**

Hills: **Steep hill down to Cathedral, and short steep hill back up.**

Refreshments/facilities: **Plenty in St. David's.**

Nearest railway station: **Haverfordwest 16 miles**

Other routes in the area:

National Route 4 continues to Fishguard and Broadhaven.

The Brunel Trail is a traffic-free section between Haverfordwest and Neyland.

Attractions:

St. David's Cathedral

The Druids Circle – the 'Gossad' – was erected for the National Eisteddfod that was held there in 1992.
