The site is level and open, with good screening from the road and in an area that traditionally has a mild, warm climate.

Britain's premier seaside resort provides non-stop amusement for the family from morning to night! Starting with the sands of course, and the famous illuminations (late August to early November), there is also Blackpool Pleasure Beach with The Big One - the tallest, scariest roller coaster in the world and Valhalla and Infusion, the latest terrifying ride to draw visitors. There are seven floors of fun at The Tower and a wide range of attractions and entertainment 365 days a year.

There's horse riding near to the site and walkers should head for Beacon Fell, 40 minutes by car. It's also an ideal touring base for the beautiful Lake District and Yorkshire Dales National Parks.

RECEPTION SERVICES

Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board at the office.

Site Shop

Open at the same times as Reception. The shop sells Calor Gas, Aqua Kem, Aqua Rinse, hook-up cables, awning tie downs, sweets, ice cream, milk, canned drinks and rock pegs.

Information Room

Open at the same times as Reception. Leaflets are available about the many attractions and places of interest that you can visit during your stay.

Mobile & public telephones

All networks can be used on this site. Public telephone - there is a public telephone located next to Reception. Please note that this phone does not accept incoming calls.

PITCHES

Pitch care

Steel awning pegs are required on this site. Awnings etc must be on the hardstanding area.

Motor caravans

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motor caravan sign on display.

Vacating your pitch

If you wish to stay after 12 noon on your day of departure, it is normally not a problem unless the site is fully booked. Please check with the site warden.

Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

TV reception

As part of the Digital Switchover, this region has now had its analogue television signal switched off. In order to watch television on site you will need an Integrated Digital TV (IDTV) or a digital receiver, and you may also need an aerial or satellite dish.

Electric Hook-up

The cost of electricity is included in your pitch fee, but please help us to minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. In 2009 The Club's expenditure on electricity was £4 million and any saving can help to reduce pitch fees or invest in new sites or redevelopments.

Toilets and showers

The toilet blocks are closed for cleaning at approximately the following times: Gents: 10:30am to 11.15am. Ladies: 11.15am to 12 noon.

There is a baby and toddler bathroom for children under 4 years old.

Please ensure that children are supervised by an adult at all times.

The disabled toilet and shower facilities are located in the main block.

All keys are available from Reception.

Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are:

Washing machine £3.00, Tumble drier 70p/cycle. Washing sinks and ironing boards are also available. Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences.

SAFETY ON SITE

Pets

Please note: There is no dog walk on site. Please keep your dog on a lead at all times on the pitching areas and roads within the site, and clean up after them. Dogs have to be walked off-site.



Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not.

Fire Point

(to activate alarm/warning) Located on all service points.

Security Barrier

There are 2 security barriers on site. A remote control is given to new arrivals when they book in. This enables access to the site at all times and is only needed when entering the site. The entrance barrier remains open 9am to 8pm. The inner barriers at Reception are closed at all times and must be opened with the remote control.

Important: to gain entry to the site, please stop at the barrier before operating the fob. Outside barrier is left button, inside barrier is right button. Please do not use your control to let others on to the site.

Visitors

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at Reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at Reception. Visitors cars must be parked in the car park.
