Get to know White Water Park

This pleasantly landscaped site is adjacent to the largest white water canoeing and rafting course built to international standard in Britain. The Centre provides facilities including a sheltered viewing balcony, a drying and changing room, canoe storage area, shop and cafe.

Famous for its summer International Riverside Festival, Preston Hall Museum houses displays of toys, art and everyday life in Victorian times. Nearby Teesside Park is a shoppers' paradise with restaurants, multi-screen cinema complex and bowling alley.

Birdwatchers, wildlife enthusiasts and walkers will be spoiled for choice with over 30 miles of coastline a short drive away - tiny fishing villages, traditional holiday resorts and dramatic cliffs. For a relaxing few hours, try one of the cruises available nearby on one of Britain's most popular rivers - you can board at Castlegate Quay.

North Yorkshire Moors Railway

Richmond Castle

Breathtakingly sited on a rocky promontory above the River Swale, the great castle of Richmond is among the oldest Norman stone fortress in Britain, begun in the decades after the conquest. The towering keep, over 30 metres high and remarkably complete within, was added during the reign of Henry II in the 1170s.

RECEPTION SERVICES

Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board outside Reception.

Site Shop

Please ask at Reception for opening hours. The shop sells Aqua Kem, Aqua Rinse, Gas, newspapers to order, milk, water, ice cream, canned drinks, sweets and chocolate.

Information Room

Open 24 hours. Leaflets are available about the many attractions and places of interest that you can visit during your stay.

Mobile & public telephones

All networks can be used on this site. Public telephone - there is a public telephone in the Information Room. This phone does not accept incoming calls.

PITCHES

Pitch care

Awning ground sheets must be lifted daily if on grass.

Motor caravans

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motor caravan sign on display.

Vacating your pitch

If you wish to stay after 12 noon on your day of departure, please ask at Reception.

Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

Serviced pitches

These pitches have an allweather surface and usually an individual ground level inlet for grey water. Further shared facilities include an illuminated EHU bollard and drinking water.

TV reception

Television reception is fair.

Electric Hook-up

The cost of electricity is included in your pitch fee, but please help us to minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. In 2009 The Club's expenditure on electricity was £4 million and any saving can help to reduce pitch fees or invest in new sites or redevelopments.

Toilets and showers

The toilet block is closed for cleaning at the times shown on the block doors. Please ensure that children are supervised by an adult at all times. The disabled toilet and shower facilities and baby and toddler bathroom are located in the toilet block. Keys are available from Reception.

Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are:

Washing machine £3.00, Tumble drier 70p/cycle. Washing sinks and ironing board are also available. Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences.

Play areas

There is a children's play area.

SAFETY ON SITE

Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead not exceeding 3 metres at all times on the pitching areas and roads within the site, and clean up after them. The dog walk is on the public footpath/cycle way that runs down the river side of the site.



Fire Point

(to activate alarm/warning) Located at all service points. The fire assembly point is at the Late Night Arrivals area as shown on the Site map. **Vehicles and cycles**

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not.

Security Barrier

There are security barriers on site. A card for the entrance barrier can be obtained from Reception after checking in and choosing a numbered pitch. The exit barrier is automatic.

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at Reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at Reception.
