Slovenian company launches Matrix on new Renault base vehicle

carayan manufacturer to announce the launch of vehicles based on the latest Renault Master chassis.

Boasting engines that meet Euro V emissions regulations, low-profile Matrix Supreme 677 SL and 677 SC are proper four-berths, thanks to a pull-down bed over the lounge.

Towards the back, the 677 SC has a transverse double bed while its

sister model has twin singles that can be converted to a double.

Both vehicles come with five homologated travel seats, plus luxuries such as full Alde heating and hot water systems. Prices were still to be confirmed at the time of writing, but are expected to start at around £57,000.

Renault's latest engines are 2.3-litres producing 125bhp or

146bhp, also available with the six-speed semi-optional Quickshift.

Chassis will be rated at 3,500kg, with the option to go up to 3,800kgnote both models have the same starting kerbweight of 3,147kg.

Renault has also announced the development of some 25 Pro+ service centres that are committed to motor caravan servicing. For more details, call the converter

Milenco says the step in fact "far exceeds the physical requirements" of BS EN 1645 and has a maximum load "in excess of 200kg" (not 150kg as we stated). We apologise for this error and any inconvenience caused.

ATRAGIC accident took place at the Club's Grafham Water site in April, following which four-year-old Tom Tent died. Tom was cycling away from a grassed area onto the site road where he collided with the rear quarter of a motor caravan coming onto the site.

Tom's funeral took place on Tuesday 10 May and a number of Caravan Club staff members and the Chairman attended to pay our respects. At the time of writing, a cause of death has not been identified.

The thoughts of everyone at the Club are with Tom's family and friends at this very difficult time.

We also extend our thoughts to everyone on site who would have been extremely upset, and to the driver and passenger of the vehicle involved in the accident – the speed of the motor caravan involved in the accident was not an issue.

High-flying Hyundai

PRICES FOR the new Hyundai i40 Tourer, which goes on sale in September, will start from £18,395 OTR with insurance from Group 12E.

It will be available in three trim levels (Active, Style and Premium) with

the choice of three efficient engines, four power outputs and manual or automatic transmission. Hyundai's Blue Drive technologies ensure emissions from 113g/km and claimed fuel consumption of 65.7mpg.

The car comes with a high level of standard equipment, premium features and intuitive technology. Weights and towing details are still to be announced. A saloon version will follow.

Orderly Q

THE ORDER book for Audi's new Q3 compact SUV opened in June with deliveries commencing November and prices from $\pm 24,560$ OTR.

It's the first Audi SUV to offer the efficiency-focused option of a 54.3mpg front-wheel-drive variant.

Four engines will initially be available, all combining direct fuel injection with turbo charging and start-stop: 2.0-litre TFSI petrols of 168 and 209bhp and 2.0-litre TDIs with 138 and 175bhp. Six-speed manual or seven-speed S tronic gearboxes are fitted, the latter now with overrun clutch disengagement to enable fuel-saving 'coasting' if the optional Audi drive select adaptive dynamics system is fitted.

Audi claims an interior roomy enough for five adults, 1,365 litres of luggage capacity (seats folded). There are no details of weights/towing limits as yet.

Where there's a flywheel...

A LIGHT, cost-efficient and eco-friendly solution that makes a four-cylinder engine feel like a six-cylinder, while reducing fuel consumption by up to 20%, has got be good.

This autumn, Volvo will be one of the first car makers to test the potential of Flywheel KERS (Kinetic Energy Recovery System) technology on public roads. The system is fitted to the rear axle with

braking energy causing a flywheel to spin at up to 60,000rpm.

The engine driving the front wheels is switched off as braking begins, with energy stored in the flywheel used to accelerate from rest or to power the vehicle at cruising speed. If the energy in the flywheel is combined with the engine's full capacity, it will offer an extra boost of 80hp, and thanks to the swift torque build-up this translates into rapid acceleration.
