What price a fantastic Voyageur?

A STYLISH 1926 Voyageur caravan fetched £11,500 at a Bonhams auction in Oxford during March.

Featuring beautiful leaded windows, stove, oak furniture, gas lighting, a gramophone and curtained-off toilet, the Bertram Hutchings Caravans-manufactured vehicle is the height of luxury and would have cost £245 when new.

The 12ft-long Voyageur model was in production for six years, eventually being replaced by the famous, streamlined Winchester.

The Voyageur, with its distinctive straight ends and bowed sides, lantern roof and bay window at the

rear sold for around twice its estimate of £4,000-£6,000 at Bonhams Collectors' Motor Cars and Automobilia sale in Kidlington.

Digging the caravan scene

We catch up with Jo Thompson, who has a very special design for this year's Chelsea Flower Show



KENT-BASED Jo Thompson is designing the Club-sponsored 'Celebration of Caravanning' garden at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show this year. It features a 1950s caravan nicknamed Doris and embodies the spirit of the British holiday.

What gave you the idea for the garden?

I'm not a camper or a caravanner – I hold my hands up. My children had wanted to go and we found this site on the Isle of Wight called Vintage Vacations. I was slightly skeptical about what we were going to encounter, but it was the best holiday I've ever had. The children were deliriously happy being in all that open space and in a

caravan which is pared down so you only have what you need. Then I thought, I'd love to have one of those caravans as a home office and then how lovely it would be to incorporate one into a Chelsea garden.

Can you tell us a little about the design?

I looked at caravans and I thought they were a very British way of holidaying. I wanted to make it a realistic garden so there is a caravan at the end that can be anything you want it to be. It could be a place for people to stay in or just a garden shelter. I've used very evocative planting - pink and cream, roses and peonies; quite soft. There are some modern elements to it too, so we've got sculptured benches that have a curve in them that echoes the shape of the roof of the caravan. We've got a stream running through which is actually made of metal - the same material as the caravan.

When do you start growing the plants?

That started a few months ago. I found the trees two years ago on a

nursery visit and I didn't know what they'd be for at the time but I tagged them and reserved them. I found the trees before I'd even started thinking about the garden really! It's been in the planning since last July and it takes about a third of the working year to create a Chelsea garden.

How many gardens do you design each year?

It varies but we've got about 35 live projects on at the moment. But I've got three other people working with me.

Finally, if I was about to go away on a two-week holiday, what one piece of gardening advice would you give me?

Well, this year I would say don't plant any pots. There are hosepipe bans anyway and I'd go easy on the containers unless you've got a helpful neighbour.
