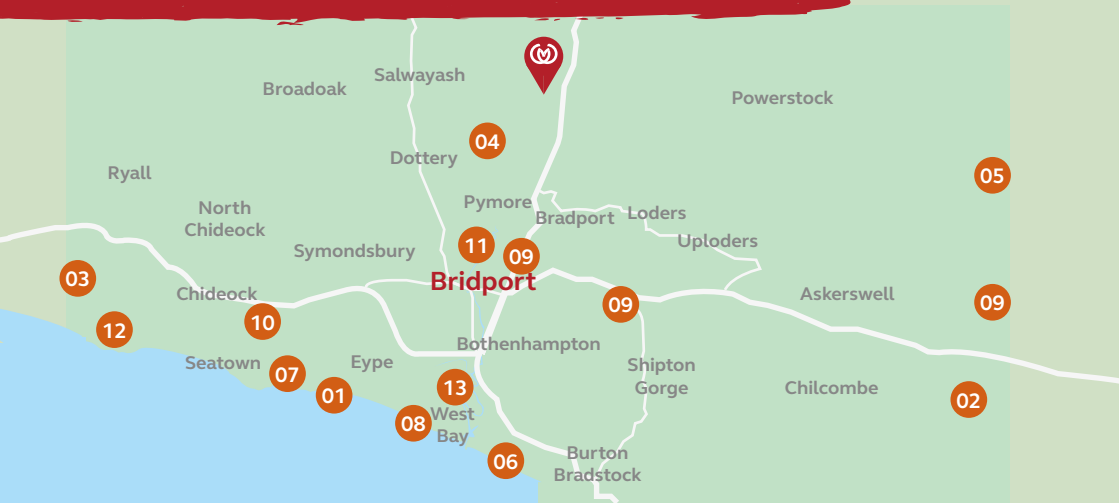

- 1 Jurassic Coast**
England's first UNESCO World Heritage Site, this famous coastline is world-renowned for being rich in prehistoric remains, which date back 185 million years.
- 2 Hardy Monument**
Built in 1844 in memory of Vice Admiral Sir Thomas Hardy, this magnificent 72ft high monument is visible from up to 60 miles away.
- 3 Donkey Sanctuary**
Located in Sidmouth, enjoy scenic trails home to hundreds of donkeys, with lots of family friendly activities and year-round events.
- 4 Dorset Nectar Cider Farm**
Producing award-winning artisan ciders with a great regard to the environment. Enjoy a tour of the orchard and learn about the processes before a tasting session.

5 Monkey World

This wonderful 65-acre open-air park provides sanctuary for rescued and endangered primates from around the globe.

6 Jurassic Fun Centre

7 Jurassic Coast

Soak up the breathtaking scenery of this spectacular coastline on one of the hundreds of connecting footpaths, which offer a huge variety of incredibly scenic walks.

8 Golden Cap

This phenomenal National Trust estate covers 25 miles of stunning footpaths, offering magnificent views from every compass point. Stonebarrow Hill is a great starting point, and an all-ability circular trail takes you through the picturesque woodlands of Langon Hill Wood.

9 Dorset Pedal

There are three incredibly scenic Dorset Pedal routes you can take in West Dorset, including Bridport and Netherbury, Hillforts and the Vale or The Frome Valley. Head to www.dorsetaonb.org.uk/project/dorset-pedal for more information.

10 National Cycle Network

The National Cycle Route 2 covers approx. 30 miles, and includes Lyme Regis, Bridport, Dorchester and many pretty villages. Please note that roads can be busy with traffic so always be cautious and follow the Highway Code.

11 Bridport

This bustling market town is rich in heritage and has an excellent reputation for arts, culture, events and food. Visit the popular antiques quarter, discover the local museum and enjoy an eclectic mix of quirky shops and cafes.

12 Lyme Regis

An ancient town featured in the Domesday Book, boasting beautiful scenery and iconic historical landmarks.

13 West Bay

A stunning seaside settlement flanked on either side by crumbling golden cliffs, with a sublime 18-mile beach.



Visitor's top tips



Weymouth

Take a boat trip from West Bay to Lyme Regis, it's incredibly scenic and relaxing.

The on-site restaurant has a great, varied menu and serves excellent food.

The Bridport market on Wednesdays and Saturdays is definitely worth visiting, with a lovely selection of stalls selling food, antiques, books and more.

There are some wonderful dog walks around the area and on-site.

We really enjoyed the Palmers Brewery tour in Bridport - book ahead as it is very popular!

Definitely visit Exeter if you have the time, we loved the Cathedral and Royal Albert Memorial Museum.

The walk from site to Bridport was around one hour, via beautiful fields and paths.

See what's on at Bridport's historic cinema, which has a stage for brilliant live performances.

Bridport Museum is very interesting, with fascinating historic exhibits and interactive displays.

Weymouth is a wonderful day out, and it's definitely worth driving up to Lulworth Cove too, it's stunning!

The Charmouth Heritage Coast Centre has fossil collections and explores the past and present of the incredible Jurassic Coast.
