## Visit



### 1 Jurassic Coast

England's first UNESCO World Heritage Site, this famous coastline is world-renowned for being rich in prehistoric remains, which date back to 185 million years.

### 2 Hardy Monument

Built in 1844 in memory of Vice Admiral Sir Thomas Hardy, this magnificent 72ft high monument is visible from up to 60 miles away.

### 3 Donkey Sanctuary

Located in Sidmouth, enjoy scenic trails home to hundreds of donkeys, with lots of family friendly activities and year-round events.

### 4 Furleigh Wine Estate

Producing some of the country's finest wines, enjoy a tour of the vineyard and winery, as well as wine tastings with incredible views.

### 5 Monkey World

This wonderful 65-acre open-air park provides sanctuary for rescued and endangered primates from around the globe.



### 6 Jurassic Fun Centre

## Explore

### 11 Bridport

This bustling market town is rich in history and has a popular reputation for its vibrant culture and great food.

### 12 Lyme Regis

An ancient town featured in the Domesday Book, boasting breath-taking scenery and iconic historical landmarks.

### 13 West Bay

A stunning seaside settlement flanked on either side by crumbling golden cliffs, with a sublime 18-mile beach.



## Walk



### 7 Jurassic Coast

Soak up the breath-taking scenery of this spectacular coastline on one of the hundreds of connecting footpaths, which offer a huge variety of incredibly scenic walks.

### 8 Golden Cap

This phenomenal National Trust estate covers 25 miles of stunning footpaths, offering magnificent views from every compass point. Stonebarrow Hill is a great starting point, and an all-ability circular trail takes you through the picturesque woodlands of Langon Hill Wood.

## Cycle



### 9 Old Railway Line

This scenic 10-mile Sustrans Cycle Route is entirely traffic-free, running from Bridport to Maiden Newton via a resurfaced, disused railway track.

### 10 National Cycle Network

The National Cycle Network Route 2 covers approximately 30 miles, and includes Lyme Regis, Bridport, Dorchester and lots of pretty villages along the way. Please note that along the way, roads can be very busy with traffic so always be cautious and follow the Highway Code.

The Bridport market on Wednesdays and Saturdays is definitely worth visiting, with a lovely selection of stalls selling food, antiques, books and more.

There are some wonderful dog walks around the area and on-site.

We really enjoyed the Palmers Brewery tour in Bridport, but you should probably book ahead as it is very popular!

The Castleman Trailway is a stunning cycle route located around an hours drive away.


Definitely visit Exeter if you have the time, we loved the Cathedral and Royal Albert Memorial Museum.
