8 Local routes

There are several walks to enjoy from the sites and in the local area.

9 Ayrshire Coastal Path

Stretching for 148km along the coastline, much of this route runs along sandy beaches. Head south from Ayr to see Greenan Castle.

Discover the history, wildlife, and landscapes of this small island.

12 Ayr

A popular seaside resort, complete with a long sandy beach.

13 Galloway Forest Park

Three hundred square miles of wild beauty to explore.

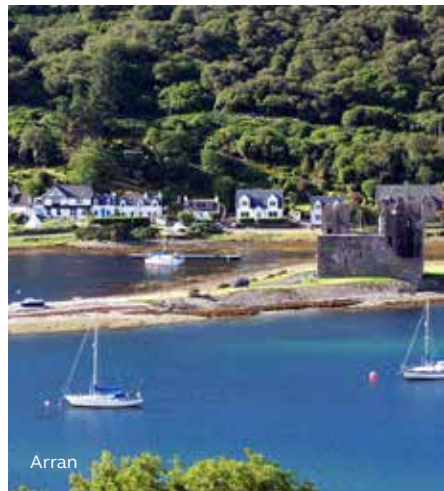
Cycle

Dunure Castle

The best fish & chips are at Troon Harbour, the Wee Hurrie - try the salmon, homemade fish cakes or even Lobster!

Visit the Tam O Shanter for good food, and of course connections to the famous Robbie Burns.

Easy walk along the river into Ayr town centre.

Take a drive down the stunning coast road A719 to Dunure, quaint 19th century harbour and castle ruins.

Ayr beach is walking distance, or a short drive away, and is great for the dogs.

Dumfries House and the gardens were very interesting.

Plenty of history in the town. Follow the walk and there are information plaques to tell all.

Calzaie Castle (National Trust) is a must! It's a great day out.
