
### 5 Sea Point Canoe and Kayak Centre

# Cathedral to Coast Cycle route

50 mile circular ride using Regional Routes 16 and 17 linking Dover, Canterbury and Folkestone along leafy lanes and bridleways, rolling hills, woodland and country villages.

Cathedral city and UNESCO World Heritage Site with cobbled streets and timber-framed houses.

# Visitor's top tips

Go to Whitstable and head to the seafood markets for great fresh seafood.

Ferry pitches are excellent. You can arrive late and depart as early as you want for either ferry or Eurotunnel.

Canterbury is a great Cathedral city with lots to see and do plus an excellent shopping centre.

If you're staying in the area but not going abroad, take a foot passenger trip to Calais for the day and explore the area.

There is a Post Office opposite site.

The Black Horse pub just outside site is great, they even have a dog menu!

The Battle of Britain Museum in Hawkinge is excellent.

The garden centre located just one mile from site serve delicious breakfasts.

Reindon woods, just up the road from the site, is perfect dog walking territory.

Historic Chatham Dockyard is an hour away by car and is well-worth a visit!

Visit St Margaret's bay. The view is amazing and so peaceful!
