



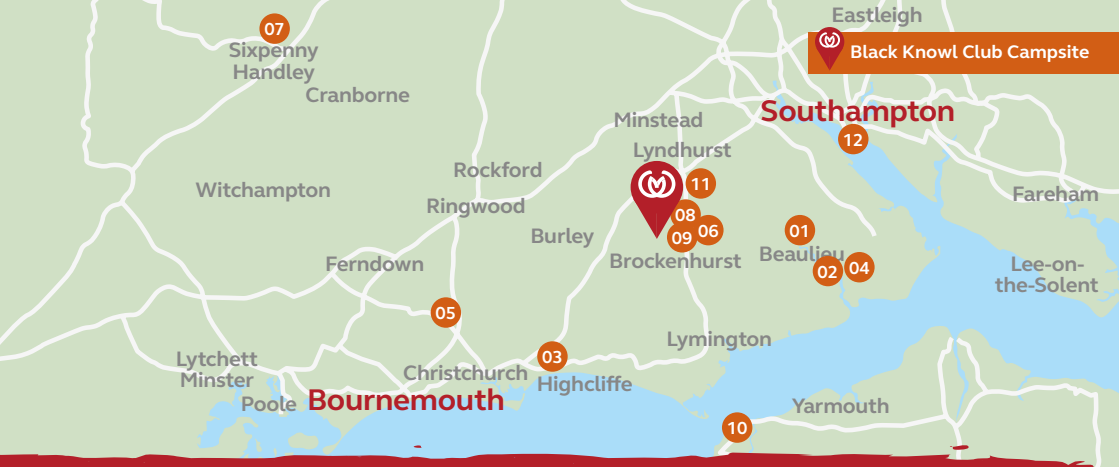

## Visit

### 1 National Motor Museum Beaulieu

Visit the world famous Museum, Palace House (home of the Montagu family) and abbey ruins.

### 2 Buckler's Hard Maritime Museum

Picturesque 18th century village on the banks of the River Beaulieu, where some of Nelson's fleet were built.

### 3 Highcliffe Castle

Built in the 1830s set in clifftop grounds with access to the Christchurch Coastal path.

### 4 Exbury Gardens and Steam Railway

World famous woodland gardens with a steam railway.

### 6 Horse Riding

Riding is a great way to explore the New Forest, and there are a number of stables nearby.

Visit the RSPB reserve at the ancient Garston Wood, a magnificent setting for bird and wildlife spotting.

## Walk

### 8 New Forest National Park

The unique landscape of the New Forest makes ideal walking; explore the ancient woodland, lowland heath and cliff top walks.

Routes are available in the information room. There is also a walking festival in September/October with many bookable guided walks.

## Cycle

### 9 National Cycle Network

The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is 2, the Southampton to Exeter railway path.

The New Forest around Brockenhurst has an extensive and beautiful cycle way network. There are routes in the Activities file in the Information Room and maps for sale in the Shop.

### 10 Isle of Wight

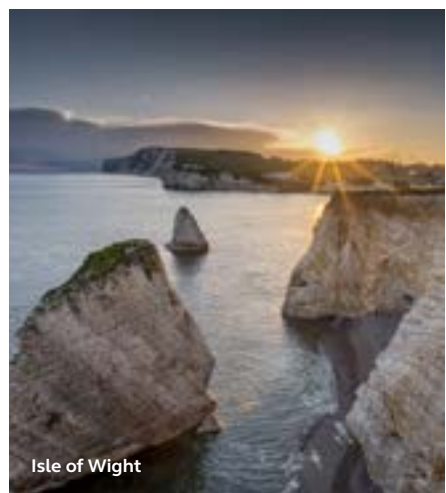
Miles of stunning coastline views and beaches, history and heritage.

### 11 Lyndhurst

The 'capital' of the area since William the Conqueror established his hunting grounds here.

### 12 Southampton

Everything you would expect from a port side city.





## Visitor's top tips

Watch the deer in the adjoining fields, you may even spot a few white stags!

Enjoy the walk into Brockenhurst, just less than 2 miles across heathland. Enjoy delightful tea rooms and treat yourself to scrumptious cakes and bread.

We found the best beach to take dogs to was Shell Bay.

The Saturday morning market at Lymington has always been a must.

The train service from Brockenhurst is excellent and opens up lots of different days out, particularly if you have bikes.

Don't forget your bike, there's plenty of places to cycle.

Try the salt water swimming pool at Lymington, we thought it was excellent.
