1 Pleasure Beach

This famous attraction features over 125 rides, entertainment and spectacular shows.

2 Illuminations

Blackpool's annual dazzle dazzle showcases 1 million bulbs over 10 kilometres (Sep - Nov).

3 Blackpool Zoo

Home to over 1500 beautiful, rare and exotic animals, set in mature parkland with lakes.

4 Stanley Park

5 Golf

Royal Lytham and St Annes Golf Club is a truly magnificent course in the heart of a Victorian estate.

6 Waterpark

Visit Sandcastle Waterpark, the UK's largest indoor waterpark with 18 slides and attractions.

7 Beacon Fell

Beacon Fell Country Park has woodland, moorland and farmland to explore. Climb to the summit for spectacular views of the Forest of Bowland and Morecambe Bay.

Lytham is a seaside town located on the Fylde coast. Lots to explore, the town has plenty of eateries, chic shops. Famous landmark is the windmill on Lytham Green. Lytham Hall has a dog friendly cafe and garden hub. Close by is Fairhaven lake RSPB visitors centre.

I The beach and area near to Lytham St Annes is less crowded than Blackpool itself, and more sedate if you're looking for a peaceful walk.

We did afternoon tea at a tea dance in the tower ballroom. You don't have to dance if you don't want to but it's an unbelievable experience to watch.

Stanley Park is lovely for a walk and has a beautiful Art Deco cafe.

We loved the Blackpool Illuminations, they were beautiful!

Lytham Hall is a wonderful visit – a grand, Georgian ancestral home with 80 acres of beautiful parkland.

We visited Fleetwood for a day, which was very pleasant with lots of places to eat and a stunning promenade.
