## Visit

- 1 Dunrobin Castle**  
An enchanting castle dating from the 15th century, with a museum, café and falconry displays.
- 2 Timespan Visitor Centre**  
A heritage centre telling the story of the Highlands - warriors and murderers, triumph and tragedy.
- 3 Brora Heritage Centre**  
Open May-September, travel through Brora's past of fishing, coal, wool and whisky industries.
- 4 Wick Heritage Museum**  
Open Easter to October, learn about Wicks' heritage

- 5 Fossil hunting**  
Brora and the surrounding coastline is great for fossil hunting.
- 6 Horse riding**  
The Star Stables is a 5 minute walk from the Heritage Centre.
- 7 Distillery visits**  
Visit Clynelish Distillery to tour the whisky factory and taste some of the local produce.

## Walk


- 8 **Loch Brora**  
You can walk for miles along the beautiful beach. Also from Brora, head for East Clyne and Loch Brora and then return to the village along the riverside.
- 9 **Golspie**  
In Golspie, the Big Burn waterfall walk takes you through woodland and across bridges. It sits beneath Ben Braggie - a steep climb but a fantastic hill walk.

## Explore

- 12 **Golspie**  
An attractive seaside village boasting a gorgeous sandy beach, beautiful walking trails and historic buildings, including St Andrews Church and Dunrobin Castle.
- 13 **Wick**  
Featuring an excellent museum and pretty harbour, this heritage town is steeped in history; Home to a vibrant shopping centre and lots of lovely cafés, independent shops and restaurants.

## Cycle

- 10 **Mountain biking**  
Highland Wildcat specialises in mountain bike trails. They have prepared three mountain bike routes around the area that are suitable for different levels of ability.
- 11 **Local routes**  
For a peaceful, circular ride on traffic free roads cycle towards Strath Brora and back via Dunrobin Glen.



# Visitor's top tips



*We saw so much wildlife - otters on the River Brora and seals and Arctic Terns on the beach, we even spotted dolphins off the coast.*

*Panning for gold at Strath of Kildonan was a great day out for kids.*

*Watch the sunrise on the beach, it's definitely worth the early start.*

*There's a fantastic golf course located directly behind site - be sure to pack your clubs!*

*The community market at Dornoch has lots of interesting stalls.*

*Walk up to the nearby Clynelish Distillery for a free tour and tasting.*

*Brora Village is a lovely area with lots of cafés, restaurants and history; we loved the museum and Heritage Trail.*

*Badbea Clearance Village is a very interesting but moving attraction, with a striking memorial and the crumbling remains of scattered stone cottages.*

*A fresh fish van visits site every Wednesday which is fantastic, and we had some excellent seafood food at the Trawler in Golpsie.*

*The Royal Marine Hotel is lovely for an evening meal or afternoon tea.*

*The nearest pub to site is the Sutherland Inn.*
