



## Walk

8 Inchree Falls

Take the forest walk to the spectacular waterfalls. You may see red squirrels en route and in the boxes in the car park.

9 Local walks

There are numerous local routes within easy reach of the site. If you plan to climb Ben Nevis, allow approximately 7 hours.

## Cycle

10 National Cycle Route

Good road/off road mountain bike routes within 15 miles of the site. The National Cycle Route 78 runs from Oban to Fort William.

Glen Righ Forest Trails

A huge network of paths and tracks for walking, dog-exercising, trail-running and mountain-biking.




## **Explore**

**12** Neptunes Staircase

Staircase lock comprising eight locks on the Caledonian Canal. Built in the early 1800's, it is the longest staircase lock in Britain.

13 Glencoe

Picturesquely located between the banks of Loch Leven and the mouth of the famous glen, it's the perfect base for exploring the area of Lochaber, known as the Outdoor Capital of the UK.





Keep an eye on the loch, if you're lucky you may catch a glimpse of cormorants or sea otters from your pitch.

Take the Corran ferry as a foot passenger (free for foot and cycles) to Ardgour and enjoy the peace and quiet, or explore the walking and cycling routes. With a vehicle drive to Ardnamurchan Point, climb the lighthouse and take in views of the Outer Hebrides.

The cable car ride up Ben Nevis range and the Fort William to Mallaig rail trips are a must.

Fort William is close with lots of walks.

Surrounded by beautiful walks and cycling, just across the road is a walk to the Inchree waterfalls and an area where you can see the red squirrels.

The closest Pub and Restaurant is Roam West about a 10 minute walk from the site.

The Tavern in Fort William is a lovely small pub with excellent service and food and a wonderful atmosphere.

Loch Leven Seafood Restaurant and The Larroch Bar & Restaurant both served excellent food.

Head to Strontian and Salen, with Sanna Bay being one of the best beaches.
