#### **Visit**

Cotswold Wildlife Park

Meet the resident rhinos, zebras and leopards, there's also an adventure playground and train.

2 Blenheim Palace

Birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill, Capability Brown landscaped park and a great lake.

Birdland Park

On the River Windrush with over 500 birds from around the world, plus picnic and play areas.

4 Crocodiles of the World

Come face-to-face with crocodiles, alligators and caiman as well as meerkats, otters, giant tortoises and even a komodo dragon in a fun, safe and educational environment.

Batsford Arboretum

6 Archery

7 Treasure trails

Explore the area with themed treasure trails. Follow a self guided Murder Mystery tour in Bourton-on-the-Water.

#### 9 Local routes

There are scenic walks of various lengths (from 2.5 to 6 miles) starting from our site. Routes and maps are available from reception.

## Cycle

### 10 Local routes

Cycle along country lanes to the lovely villages around Burford. For example, start at Burford Priory and follow a circuit to Eastleach, Kelmscott and Brize Norton which is about 30 miles in total.

## 11 National Cycle Network

The nearest National Cycle route is number 57 – following mainly on road routes.

Steeped in history and beauty with a medieval bridge and an unbroken row of ancient houses and shops.

### 13 Oxford

A picturesque city home to rich art and culture, known for its decadent university.

#### **14** Gloucester

This cathedral city has fascinating history stretching back to the Roman period.
