#### 7 Carsington Water

Try fishing, sailing, kayaking and windsurfing from the Visitor Centre at Carsington Water.

#### Peak District National Park

Britain's first National Park offers outstanding walking and some of England's finest climbing, cycling and caving.



#### **10** Carsington Water

A good walking route from the site is Carsington Water.

## Cycle

#### 11 Monsal and Tissington trails

The High Peak, Monsal and Tissington Trails are about 6 miles away and there are many other local trails and quiet roads. Bike hire is available at Carsington Water Visitor Centre.

#### 12 National Cycle Network

The nearest site to the site is 68, Derby to Berwick-upon-Tweed.

#### 13 Ladybower Reservoir


An area of outstanding natural beauty surrounded by beautiful woodland, water and moors. Ideal for walking and outdoor activities.

#### 14 Codnor Castle

A ruined 13th-century castle mentioned in the Doomsday Book of 1086.

#### 15 Ashbourne

A pretty, cobbled market town with lots of historic buildings, shops, pubs and restaurants.





## Visitor's top tips

Carsington Water's Fly Fishing by boat is one of the best in the Country.

Ashbourne is nice for a visit, with plenty of shops and coffee shops. Visit the Tourist Information and book on the guided tour which explains a little about the history of the place.

Visit Wetton Mill Farm, where you can enjoy the tea shop, kids can paddle in the stream, and you can walk to Thor's cave – a little known treasure with great views and clambering for younger members of the family.

Denby pottery is about a 30 minutes drive away but is worth a visit.

Go for a picnic by the water, there is good playground facilities for the kids.

Carsington Reservoir has a great cycle path and can also be walked around, the bluebells in early may were amazing.

Matlock Bath is Derbyshire's answer to inland sea side.

Cromford Mills is a great day out for the family, part of the Derwent Valley Mills UNESCO Heritage Site. Enjoy interactive displays, captivating stories, guided tours plus cafes and shops.
