




Places to see and things to do in the local area

Visit

Peveril Castle

Wonder at the inspiring views of the Peak District from the remains of Peveril Castle.

Peak Cavern

Peak Cavern boasts one of the largest cave entrances in Britain.

3 Treak Cliff Cavern

An underground wonder of stalactite and stalagmite rocks, and home to the Blue John Stone.

4 Eyam Village & Museum
Pretty village noted for outbreak
of Bubonic Plague in 1665.

5 Underground boat trip

Take an incredible journey by boat through the flooded underground 18th century lead mine at Speedwell Cavern.

6 Go Ape Buxton

Brave the heights of the tree top obstacle course with a zip wire, Tarzan swings, rope ladders and crossings.

Peak District National Park

Britain's first National Park offers outstanding walking, as well as some of England's finest climbing, cycling and caving.

8 The Great Ridge

This is an easy walk over and beyond the Peak District's most fascinating hill – Mam Tor.

11 Ladybower Reservoir

One of the most photographed spots in the Peak District.

12 Castleton

This beautifully situated village is the only place in the world where the semi-precious Blue John stone can be found.

13 Buxton

Spa town with stunning gardens and famous Georgian and Victorian architecture.

9 Local routes

The Hope Valley is a popular part of the Peak District to discover by bike. Cycle through moorland landscapes, experience traditional Dark Peak villages and enjoy spectacular gritstone edges. 10 National Cycle Network

The nearest route to this site is 68, Derby to Glossop, which is part of the Pennine Cycleway. National Cycle Route 6 enters the Peak District National Park at Ringinglow then uses the dam wall of the Ladybower Reservoir to reach Castleton.



Don't miss the Christmas tree displays around the village in December.

Pack your walking boots and plan a route that ends in Castleton, at one of the numerous (dog friendly) good pubs!

Listen out for owls at night and look to the sky for some amazing star scapes!

Castleton is the only known source of the mineral Blue John – visit the Blue John Mines and jewellers in town.

Well dressings are fantastic community events unique to the Peak District where wells are decorated with flower petals from May to August. There are lots of opportunities for mountain biking in the area.

The bakery does excellent pies, bread and cakes baked fresh every day and they open into the early evening.

Walk beyond the youth hostel next door to the site and follow the footpath up onto the hills. A wonderful walk that takes you round to Mam Tor and back into Castleton

The walk from Castleton to Hope is very pleasant and not too strenuous. We also walked round Ladybower Reservoir (6 miles) but you could also cycle it.

There's a bus stop a minute's walk away, and a train station 45 minutes walk away (1.7 miles).
