



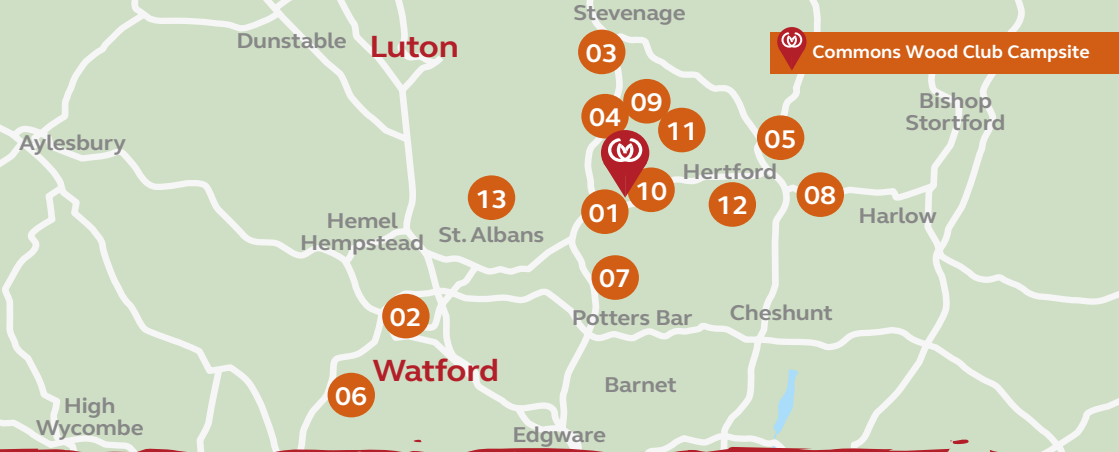

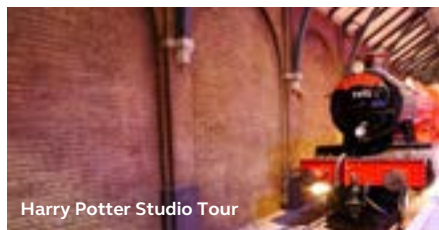

## Walk

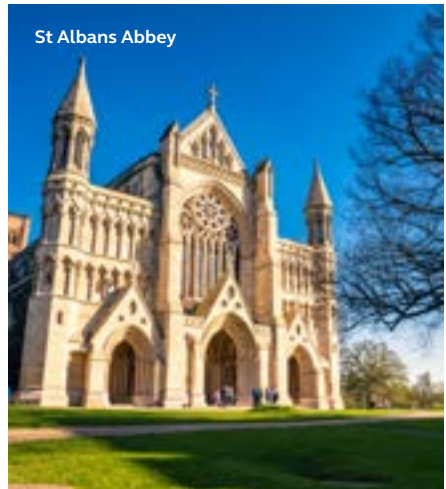
- 8 Rye Meads Nature Reserve**  
RSBP Wetland reserve beside the river Lee. Guided walks are also offered.
- 9 Digswell Viaduct**  
Starting at Burnham Green, head across the country footpaths around the pretty village of Tewin. From here, cross the open countryside to the breath-taking Digswell Viaduct, an impressive Victorian structure dating back to 1850.

## Explore

- 12 Hertford**  
A charming and historic market town in the Hertfordshire countryside, home to the fascinating Hertford Castle and a rich heritage.
- 13 St. Albans**  
In this jewel of a city, you'll find a wonderful blend of history, culture, entertainment, markets, shopping and lots of eateries. The beautiful Abbey is also a must-see, offering free guided tours.

## Cycle

- 10 National Cycle Network**  
Routes 12, 57 and 61 are nearby.
- 11 The Cole Green Way**  
This scenic route runs from Hertford to Welwyn Garden City along a flat, scenic pathway of a former railway line.

## Visitor's top tips

**||** Hatfield House has a monthly Antiques and Farmers Market, as well as shops and a restaurant at The Stable Yard.

Try the large heated outdoor swimming pool in Hitchin, open from late May to early September.

Stanborough Park has 2 large lakes and 126 acres of award winning parkland. There are nature walks, orienteering trails, watersports and more.

Welwyn Garden City is a must-see in this area, it's a piece of modern history and beauty all-in-one!

The Red Lion is a lovely pub in Hatfield, serving great food & drink.

Lee Valley Regional Park stretches across 10,000 beautiful acres and is a wonderful spot to walk the dog!

Visit the village of Lemsford, where you'll find a church and cosy pubs.
