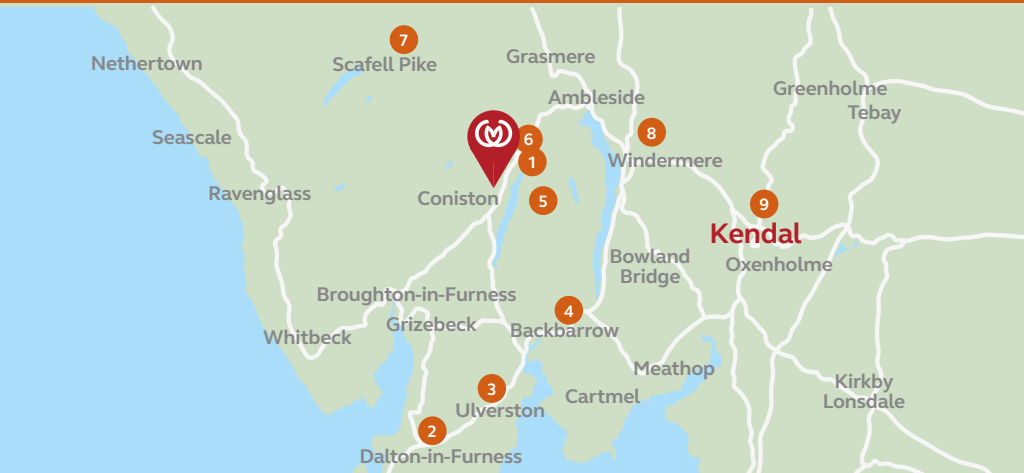

## Things to do

### 1 Coniston Launch Lake Cruises

Regular, year-round, scenic boat cruises either commuter-style, hop on/off or guided on Coniston Water. Boats are heated, enclosed saloons for 35 people with outdoor seating.

### 2 South Lakes Safari Park

A large, hilly wildlife park home to animals, including tigers, rhinos and lions. Open-access enclosures for lemurs and kangaroos and daily feeding of giraffes and penguins.

### 3 The Laurel and Hardy Museum

A dedicated museum celebrating the life and work of Stan Laurel and Oliver Hardy. It houses the world's largest collection of memorabilia and continuous film screenings.

### 4 Lakeside and Haverthwaite Railway

A heritage steam railway running restored steam trains offering scenic views, connections, a station tea room, engine shed and woodland playground.

### 5 Grizedale Forest Park

An enormous woodland renowned for walking and cycling trails, acclaimed sculptures and Go Ape treetop adventures, with panoramic views.

### 6 Joint Outdoor Adventures

A diverse range of action-packed, team-focused activities such as quad trekking, airsoft, scrambling and axe throwing, for all abilities.

### 7 Scafell Pike

The highest mountain in England, standing at 978 metres. Characterised by its rugged, rocky summit plateau, steep ascents and panoramic views.

### 8 Windermere

England's largest natural lake, formed by glaciers 13,000 years ago – premier tourist hub known for scenic mountains, 18 islands and popular water activities.

### 9 Kendal

A bustling, historic market town serving as the Lake District southern gateway. Famous for its Kendal Green wool heritage and Kendal Mint Cake.

## Walk

Beginning above the village of Coniston with views out to Coniston Water and beyond, climbs through old quarry workings before reaching the summit.

The Lake District is England's largest National Park and includes England's highest mountain, Scafell Pike and deepest lakes.

## Cycle

Regional route 37 runs along the far side of Coniston, and there is a local route towards Torver. All routes take you alongside the lake and through delightful countryside.

### Accessing the site

Site access restrictions:

- ✓ Barrier fob issued on arrival

### Accessing the facilities

Facility access restrictions:

- ✓ Key operated door locks – key issued on arrival
- ✓ Key operated door lock on the accessible room and family room

### Connectivity

- ✓ Mobile phone signal – good. Mobile phone signal may vary depending on network provider
- ✓ TV reception – poor. Aerial cable to connect to site TV booster system
- ✓ Club Wi-Fi. *The signal can drop due to being a wooded site*

### In an emergency

Emergency out of hours information can be found on the reception door/window, information room, and facility block notice board.

### Laundry facilities

- ✓ Machines are token operated only. Tokens are available from reception at £1.25 each. All washing machine cycles are £5, pre-wash is £1.25 and a 15 minute tumble dryer cycle is £1.25
