

# Visitor's top tips

Dolphin spotting, Chanonry Point



*In Inverness, use the Old Town Rose Street car park - it's suitable for motorhomes and cheaper than others.*

*A visit to Inverness Botanic gardens is a must, with free entry.*

*Visit Chanonry Point on Black Isle to see the dolphins as the tide is starting to come in.*

*Visit the local Distillery at Muir of Ord, fantastic visit and a rare chance to try a dram of Singleton.*

*Visit some of the beautiful stately homes and castles in the area.*

*Lossiemouth Beach is absolutely stunning.*

*Fort George is a must-see in the area.*

*There are lots of beautiful dog walks in the area, from the woodlands next to site to Nairns Beach.*

*We had such a lovely day out at the RZSS Wildlife Park, where you can see a diverse range of animals from tigers, arctic foxes and polar bears to snowy owls, red squirrels, camels and leopards.*

*There are some fantastic golf courses near to site - be sure to pack your clubs!*
