
6 Quad Nation

8 Local routes

Good walking routes near the site are the footpaths around Romney Marsh and the Royal Military Canal. Near Army Ranges so not suitable for nervous dogs.

There are cycle routes adjacent to the site and around Romney Marsh. The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is route number 2, Dover to Newhaven.

10 Folkstone


Explore pretty cobbled streets lined with art galleries and quirky stores, with a quaint harbour

Godington House & Gardens is a lovely visit with stunning walks.

The National Trust's Smallhythe Place is a wonderful day out, once home to the famous Victorian actress Ellen Terry; Bodiam Castle and Chartwell House are also excellent sites to visit.

If you have time, definitely make a visit to Canterbury or Hastings – both offer so much to do and see.

Camber Sands is only 40 minutes away, home to a beautiful beach and castle.
