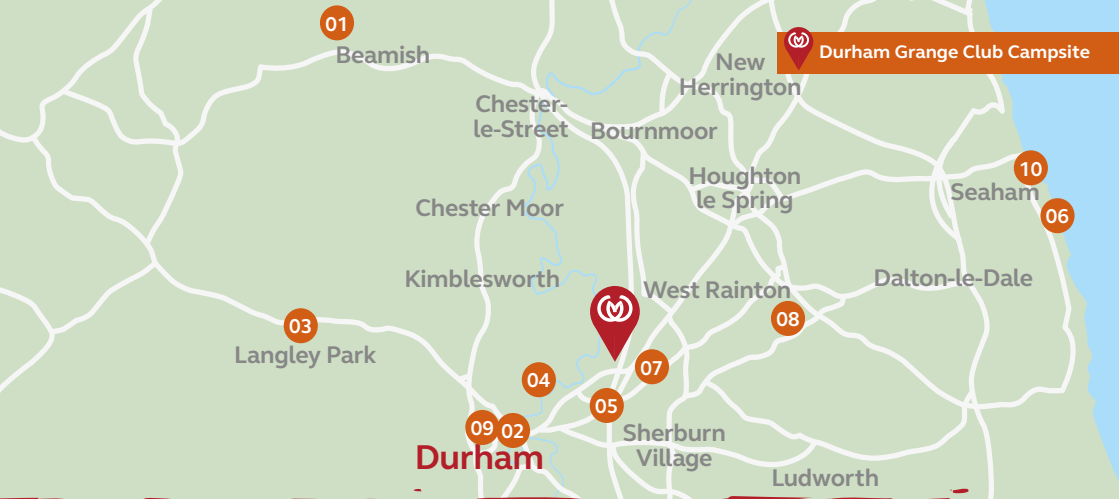

Cycle

7 National Cycle Routes

Route 14 runs from Darlington in County Durham, north-east to Hartlepool, then north-west through Durham to Consett. Route 70 also passes near the site, this long-distance coast-to-coast cycle route links Walney Island by Barrow-In-Furness to Sunderland.

6 Durham Heritage Coast Walk

This 11 mile route runs from Seaham to Crimdon along stunning cliff-top scenery following the England Coast Path National Trail.

8 Adventure Valley

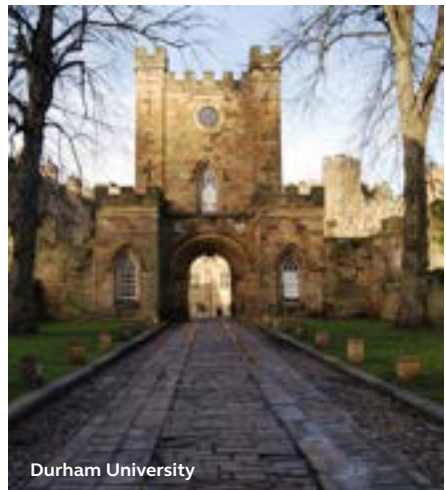
Kids' indoor and outdoor soft play areas, plus roller disco, crazy golf, farm animals and a cafe.

9 Oriental Museum

A collection of more than 23,500 Chinese, Egyptian, Korean, Japanese and other artefacts.

10 Seaham

Admire the dramatic cliff top views, seek out one of England's oldest churches or simply relax at the beach.





Visitor's top tips



Wander around the little lanes of Durham off the beaten track where you will find artisans and independent coffee bars in abundance.

The Angel of the North an amazing, imposing sculpture is free to visit and well worth it!

Take a walk along the footpath by the river into the city.

Whitburn and Seaburn are lovely Seaside areas to visit with small villages around too.

Visit the information room on site which has recommendations for all local tourist attractions.

Durham's Saturday open market is lovely to walk round and also the indoor market is worth a visit.
