A diverse range of activities including sailing, racing, watersports or touring the Firth.


6 The Kelpies

10 National Cycle Network

The nearest National Cycle Network route in Route 1, Dover to Shetland.

11 Cramond Loop

This 13 mile scenic passes through the North Edinburgh path network to Cramond, offering lovely coastal views, before passing into the city.

12 The Old Town, Edinburgh

Edinburgh's Old Town draws up dreamy images of cobbled streets, historic houses and picturesque squares. Make sure to stroll down Victoria Street and visit some of the charming local boutiques and excellent restaurants.

13 Leith

Enjoy the delights from curio shops to a diverse range of cafés, restaurants and bars.

14 Culross

One of the most picturesque villages in Scotland, often used as a film and television location.



II Edinburgh park run every Saturday at Cramond beach - only 10 minutes walk

from the site is really welcoming.

Enjoy the stunning walk along the shores of the River Forth with cafés and a pub on route.

The Royal Botanic Gardens, are breathtaking at any time of year.

If the tide is out you can walk across the causeway to Cramond Island, but take note of the sign telling you the safe (low tide) times to do this, and make sure you allow enough time to cross back.

We cycled to a fascinating cave tour out at Gilmerton Cove.

The Scottish National Museum is fantastic. We visit every time we are in Edinburgh and we still haven't seen everything.

There is a lovely walk along the river, which is very popular with families and dog walkers. Within 2 miles along this walk is the village of Cramond, a village with a cosy pub and river walk.

Would highly recommend the East Fortune Airfield and Museum of Flight.
