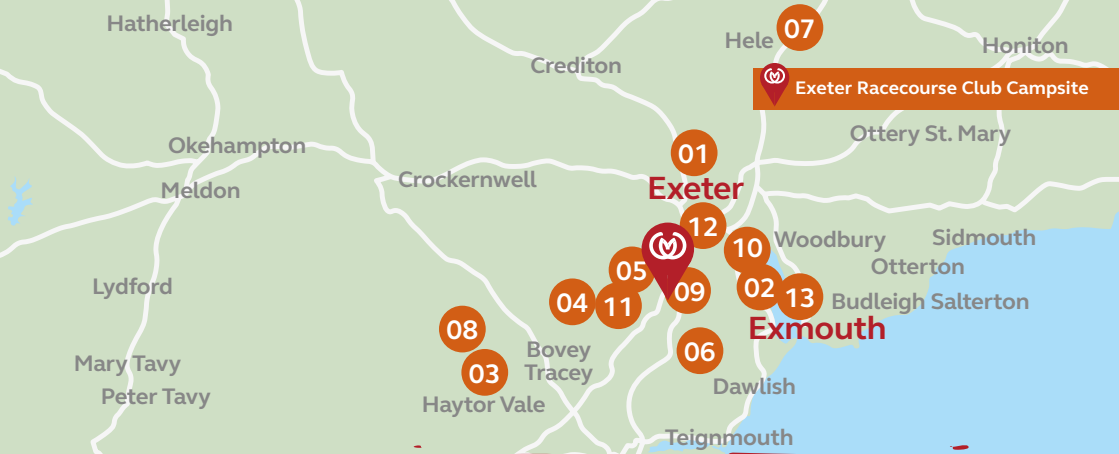

## Visit

- 1 **Exeter Cathedral**  
One of the finest examples of Gothic architecture in England. Dating back over 900 years.
- 2 **Powderham Castle**  
Stunning views and grounds to explore plus adventure play area, pets corner, and nature nook.
- 3 **Dartmoor National Park**  
The largest and wildest area of open country in Southern England, there are several Visitor Centres.
- 4 **Cantonteign Falls**  
Breathtaking waterfalls and lakes, along with a Children's' play area.

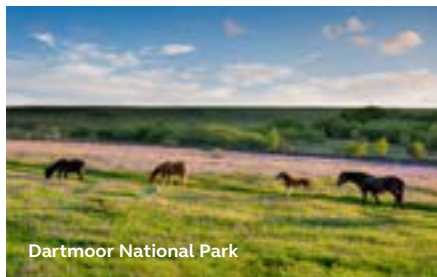

## Walk

### 8 Becky Falls

Voted Devon's top beauty spot, with woodland walks, waterfalls, animals and a full entertainment programme during school holidays.

### 9 Local Walks

The road around the racecourse is 2 miles (with paths back to the site if that is too far). Belvedere Forest is within 10 minutes drive and has way-marked paths and a raptor observation platform.

## Cycle

### 10 National Cycle Network

The nearest route is number 2, Exeter to Plymouth.

### 11 Haldon Forest Park

Way-marked walks and excellent off-road cycling.



## Explore

### 12 Exeter

One of England's most vibrant, beautiful and historically-abundant cities, home to a unique range of attractions and a glorious cathedral.

### 13 Exmouth

Home to two miles of sandy beach and lots of little shops and lovely restaurants, this is one of Devon's oldest seaside towns, and is ideal for visiting the Jurassic Coast.





## Visitor's top tips

**||** We recommend the park and ride as parking in Exeter can be tricky.

Buckfastleigh Abbey is a real must to visit... the kids loved it!

There are very attractive walks on both sides of the river at the Quays.

Exeter has a very nice city centre and the cathedral is quite magnificent.

On a Sunday there are two very good car boot sales – One starting at 7am just down the hill from the site. The other is on the racecourse site at 1pm.

There are some great dog walks on site.

The Route 5 American Diner is located adjacent to site, and serves large portions of great food at a reasonable price.

We really enjoyed the Exeter Red Coat Walking Tour, and it's completely free!

Dartmoor and Plymouth are great days out with so much to see and do.

We had a wonderful day out at Paignton Zoo Environmental Park.

House of Marbles is a great visit for the family with attractions for all ages.
