A visit to Barafundle Bay is a must, the views and beach are amazing.

The wildlife-rich Bosherton Lily Ponds are a gorgeous and easy dog walk.

Head to the National Trust's Stackpole to discover award-winning beaches, tranquil woodlands and lily ponds.

Folly Farm is a wonderful day out for the whole family, with a lovely zoo, barn and fairground.
