  Home to threatened bird
  species, adders, bumblebees and
  butterflies as well as dragonflies
  and frogs. The woodlands are
  managed for vulnerable species.

  A unique aircraft collection
  showing the aviation timeline.
  Open on Fridays and weekends.

- 4 Nymans National Trust
  Extensive yet intimate gardens
  - extensive yet intimate gardens which adorn a romantic house and impressive ruins.

- 8 Local Walks

## Visitor's top tips

Horsham, Tunbridge Wells and East Grinstead are great towns for shopping, eating and entertainment.

Lowfield Heath Windmill is a working 18th century windmill just outside Charlwood and is well worth a visit.

Don't miss a visit to Brighton and London by train. The site is brilliantly located for visiting both the capital and the coast.

We had a great time at the Bluebell Railway. We took a day trip to Jersey, from Gatwick airport. Goff's Manor is a nice pub on the outskirts of Crawley. Wander around Goff's park before enjoying some classic pub food.

The Wings Museum provides a fascinating insight into life during World War II. The artefacts and memorabilia tell their own unique story, along with the sounds and music of the times.

Crawley is a good sized town with lots of shopping, a cinema, sports centres, public golf course at Tilgate, driving range, footgolf, indoor karting.
