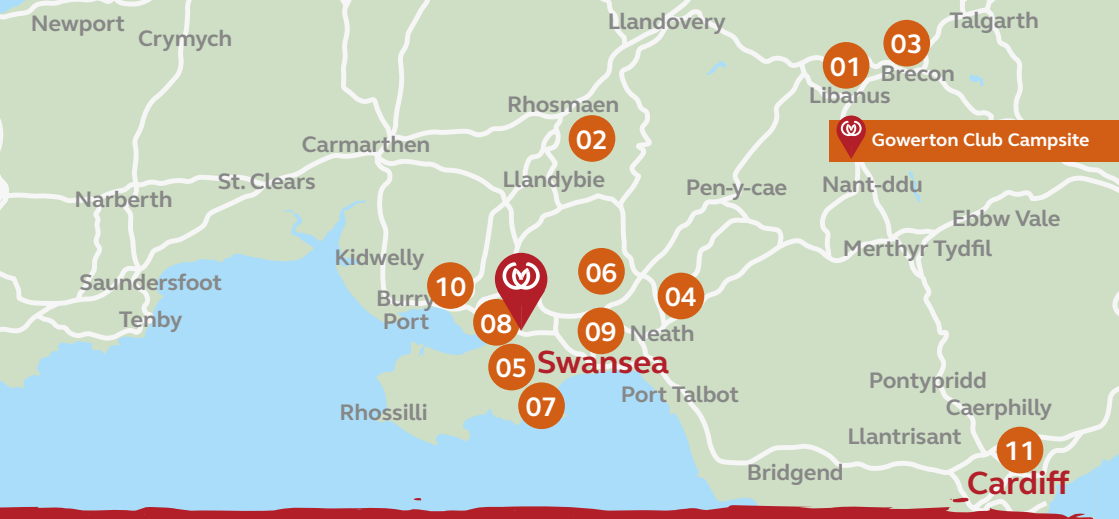

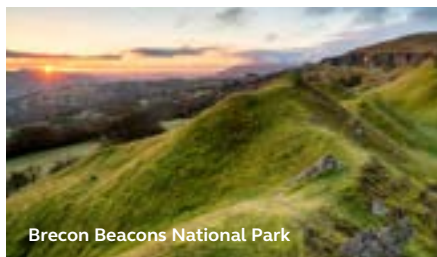
## Visit

- 1 **Brecon Beacons National Park**  
Romantic ruins, mysterious caves and extraordinary scenery, to places telling the story of its industrial heritage.
- 2 **Carreg Cennen Castle**  
High up on a limestone crag, overlooking the remote Black Mountain and the Cennen River.
- 3 **Brecon Cathedral**  
Magnificent cathedral with a heritage centre, shop and restaurant to enjoy while you're there.
- 4 **Aberdulais Tin Works and Waterfall**  
The most scenic waterfall in Wales, best known for their electricity-producing waterwheel, the largest of its kind in Britain.

### 7 Local routes

All the Gower beaches are within easy driving distance.

Also visit Craig Gwladys where you can walk the forest trails and climb the steep ascent with the hang-gliders soaring above you.

## Cycle

### 8 Local Routes

Cycling is suggested on the Millennium Cycle path within 2 miles of the site and there are also routes around the Swansea and Mumbles cycle path. Information is available from the office and Information Room.

The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is route 4, The Celtic Trail West.

### 9 Swansea

A vibrant city boasting a stunning coastal setting and bustling waterfront.

### 10 Llanelli

This town offers lots of historic sites and quirky shops. The popular WWT reserve is also just outside of Llanelli.

### 11 Cardiff

Wales' capital, with excellent shopping, unique attractions and a blend of innovative and historic architecture.





## Visitor's top tips

**||** LLangennith Bay is excellent for surfers and is also dog-friendly.

Don't miss Joe's Ice Cream Parlour at Mumbles!

A visit to Rhosilli and Worms Head is a must. The pub there serves good food and the views are breathtaking. One of the UK's top 10 beaches.

Waterfront Museum in Swansea (free) followed by a river cruise on River Tawe which depicts Swansea's heritage.

There's an excellent dog walking area on site.

You'll be spoilt for choice with lots of gorgeous walks in the area.

Gower Peninsula is a walkers paradise, with stunning beaches and great birdwatching.

The Welsh Botanic Gardens is a must – located a 25 minute drive away.

Take a tour of Gower Brewery, it's fantastic, using traditional methods to create delicious beer.

The nearby Rake & Riddle pub has a nice atmosphere and serves great food. **||**
