### 1 Wensleydale Creamery

Explore the home of the famous cheese, made here since 1150.

### 2 Bolton Castle

A spectacular Medieval Fortress, with stunning view of the Dales.

### 3 Wensleydale Railway

Discover the heart of the Dales on Yorkshire's secret railway.

### 4 The Forbidden Corner

A 4 acre walled garden filled with tunnels, statues and surprises, great for all the family.

### 5 Geocaching

### 10 Hawes

This little market town is famous for being England's highest, set at 850ft above sea level. Home to awe-inspiring scenery and unique attractions, including the Wensleydale cheese creamery.



### 11 Leyburn

Surrounded by spectacular countryside scenery, this charming town offers lots of quirky shops and cafés, traditional pubs and a lovely weekly market.

### 7 Hawes & Local area

Hawes is a 10 minute walk from the site. There area also local maps available in reception.

### 8 The Yorkshire Dales Nationals Park

Explore the stunning scenery of this area on foot.

### 9 Stage 1 Cycles

This bike shop also has a cafe and hires out mountain, road and electric bikes by the day. They'll also give you suggested routes, including the Tour De France route.

## Visitor's TOP TIPS

Ideal for motorhomes, just a short walk into Hawes for unique shops, restaurants, pubs, and a bus service to Northallerton, Bedale and Leyburn.

Visit the Kettlewell Scarecrow Festival in August.

A walk from site to Hardraw Force is a must, it's mostly flat so is quite easy.

Get up early on a Tuesday and walk up into town for the market, offering a good range of fresh food and produce, especially fish.

Head to the White Scar Cave for a guided tour - it covers around 1 mile over 80 minutes and is phenomenal!

There are several dog-friendly pubs and cafés in the local area; the White Hart Inn and Green Dragon are particularly lovely.


'The Chippy' shop in Hawes serves excellent, fresh fish & chips.

## Close by

### Supermarkets

There is a Tesco in Catterick Garrison or an Asda in Kendal, both are approximately 25 miles from site. However, there is a spar, butchers and a bakery in Hawes.
