### 1 Brownsea Island

Take a ferry from Poole for wonderful views, wildlife and history.

### 2 Monkey World

Home to over 230 rescued and endangered monkeys.

### 3 Corfe Castle

Be captivated by the castle ruins and breathtaking views.

### 4 Lulworth Cove Heritage Centre

Discover the iconic cove and Durdle Door, with displays, animations & films.

### 5 Studland Bay

3 miles of fine, sandy beaches with watersports in the summer months.

### 6 Coasteering

Explore the coast from a different perspective as you jump, climb and swim your way around areas inaccessible from the land.

### 7 Wareham Boat Hire

Explore the River Frome from the water with motor boats, kayaks, canoes, rowing boats and paddle boards to hire.

## Walk

### 8 The Jurassic Coast

This historic stretch of coastline has miles of paths to explore while you admire the impressive views.

### 9 Wareham Forest Way

This Wareham to Sturminster Marshall route passes the site and offers beautiful views, an Iron Age hill fort and lots of wildlife.

## Cycle

### 10 Purbeck Cycleway

This 47 mile circular route takes in Wareham Quay, Swanage, Corfe Castle and other scenic spots. Pick up a leaflet from Discover Purbeck Information Centre.

### 11 Sika Cycle Trail

A 7 mile numbered trail a suitable for cyclists of all ages and abilities. Cycle hire is available.

## Visitor's top tips

**II** The SIKA trail for off road cycling and walking has a large car park and is within 1 mile of the site.

Hire a boat or canoe in Wareham and spend the day exploring the River Frome.

The local butchers (Curtis est. in 1951) in Wareham, has quality local meat and homemade sausages and pies.

It's worth walking to the top of Golden Top, it's the highest point on the coast.

Walk from Kimmeridge east along the coast and west towards Lulworth.

Try the Poole Parkrun, there's a lovely atmosphere.

It's well worth a visit to Lymington. A lovely Georgian town with a lovely picturesque Quay.

Monkey World and the tank museum are a great family day out.

Studland Bay is the nearest beach and provides excellent facilities for beach activities and dog walks. **II**
