



5 The Big Shoot

Enjoy the fun competitive thrills of Clay Pigeon Shooting.

6 Go Ape – Aberfoyle

A good walking route near the site is towards Loch Tay and joining the old railway line through Killin.

The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is route number 7, Glasgow to Pitlochry, Lochs and Glens Route North.






12 Perth

Perth is the perfect base to explore everything that Perthshire has to offer: fine dining, great shopping, adventure sports, history and culture.

13 Strathyre

Strathyre's beautiful and lush green forests cover the hills on each side of the valley. A great base to explore Edinburgh and Glasgow, which are both around an hour away.





Ask at reception about local restaurants as some give discounts for members.

This area is rich in history, visit the The Battle Of Bannockburn Experience and the Wallace Monument in Stirling.

The old railway walk to the Falls and village is lovely.

There are watersports centres at Killin, Lochearnhead and Kenmore on Loch Tay.

Visit Callander which is on the road to Stirling or Kenmore, it is a pleasant town at the head of the loch.

The local fish and chip van is handy.

We had excellent days out at Stirling, Oban, Fort William and the stunning Falls of Dochart.

The walk down Pier Road to Loch Tay was undemanding and very scenic.

Go kayaking, swimming, walking, it's all close by. There are beautiful walks up Ben Lawers nature reserve.
