





Step back in time with a visit to Hill Top Farm – a must for Beatrix Potter lovers!



8 Local routes

The 70 mile Cumbrian Way passes near the site linking Ulverston and Carlisle.

There is also the Cumbria Coastal Path.

Walk to Grange-over-Sands, 3 miles from site.

Guided walks with the Queen's guide at various times through the year.


Explore

10 Ulverston

Lined with cobbled streets, this market town is the start of the 70 mile Cumbrian Way. It is also the birthplace of Stan Laurel, and home to the world's only Laurel and Hardy Museum.

11 Cartmel

A beautiful lakeland village with an 800 year old priory. Popular with foodies for its excellent restaurants, famous cheese chop and the original Sticky Toffee Pudding shop.





Visitor's top tips

|| Visit Grange-over-Sands for stunning scenery and walking routes.

Go round to Arnside, on the other side of the bay, and watch the bore tide come in.

Good walk from the site to Grange-over-Sands then along the promenade and the coastal path to Humphrey Head Point, 6.5 miles each way.

A Windermere cruise makes a great, scenic day out.

The Grange Over Sands promenade is just a lovely walk.

I would recommend a visit to Holker Hall, lovely place and very good food.

Great days out include Levens Hall, Sizergh Castle as well as the obvious attractions of The Lakes.

We enjoyed the Lakeland miniature village and the motor museum.

Utilise the information room on site as it is crammed full of ideas.

Get the train from Grange Over Sands to Ulverston, it is a very nice day out.

There's a hotel within walking distance from the site gate called the Woodlands, it serves good food at reasonable prices. ||
