



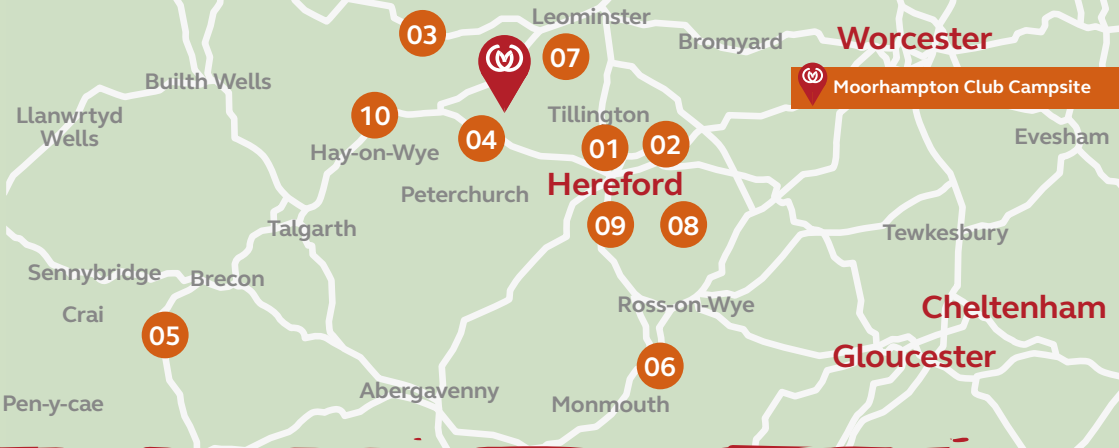

There is a pretty circular walk close to site which takes in the old cider orchard and the now defunct railway bridges.



## Explore

### 9 Hereford

A vibrant and naturally beautiful city with a picturesque lake and lots of fascinating history. Visit the Cathedral, stroll around the traffic-free centre or enjoy a show at the Courtyard Theatre.

### 10 Hay-on-Wye

Well-known as 'the town of books', it comes as no surprise that this delightful town has over 30 bookshops, alongside lovely pubs, cafes and art galleries.



## Visitor's top tips

**||** For a truly stunning panoramic view of the Brecon Beacons, Shropshire Hills, the Black Mountains and the Malvern Hills, walk up the Hergest Ridge, less than 11 miles from site.

Visit Hay-on-Wye for the Annual Literary Festival in May, and visit the many bookshops all year round. Llanthony Priory is also a great visit for history enthusiasts.

The site is a great location for the beautiful River Wye for canoeing, fishing water sports and boat trips.

The Portway Inn served excellent food with friendly service, and is within easy walking/cycling distance from site.

Oakchurch Farm Shop is well worth a visit, with a garden centre, restaurant, food hall and delicious fresh produce.

Weobley Village is definitely worth a visit, it feels as if you're stepping back in time with its Tudor buildings and quirky pubs.

We found lots of National Trust sites around the area, all of which were in easy reach, including Croft Castle. **||**
