Visit

1 Whitehouse Farm

Feed, hold & stroke animals from around the world including meerkats & owls.

2 Cragside House

The first ever house to be lit by hydroelectricity, this extraordinary property is crammed full of stillworking Victorian gadgets.

- 3 Corbridge Roman Fort
 Travel back in time at the
 Corbridge Roman town.
- 4 Alnwick Castle

One of the largest inhabited castles in England. You may recognise it as Hogwarts in the Harry Potter films.

5 Northumberland Country Zoo

A family-run zoo with over 50 unique species, offering a fun, interactive and educational day.

6 Adventure Northumberland, Alnwick

Enjoy a full range of outdoor water activities including canoeing, sea kayaking and stand-up paddleboarding.

7 Fishing

There is trout fishing at the Fontburn Reservoir. The River Coquet also offers trout fishing, permits for this may be purchased from Thropton Post Office.

Walk

8 Local routes

There are numerous walks within a short drive from site, and in Northumberland National Park. Simonside and Lake Bolam are favourite local walks from site, and there is also a beautiful nature reserve walk which runs up to Nunnykirk House.

9 Druridge Bay

Discover seven beautiful miles of white sandy beach and abundant wildlife at this coastal gem. Also popular for cycling, horse riding and watersports.

10 Northumberland National Park

Visit Hadrian's Wall, go hiking or trail running, cycle out on quiet country roads or challenge yourself on two National Trails

11 National Cycle Network

The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is route number 68. Hexham to Berwick.

12 Hexham

Holding the title of England's favourite market town, offering an abundance of historical and cultural attractions, including Hexham Abbey, a bustling market and a thriving arts scene.

13 Newcastle upon Tyne

Popular for its fascinating museums, entertainment and culture, this riverside city boasts three large shopping centres and lots of beautiful, historic buildings.





Visitor's top tips

For dog owners, if you fancy a meal out in Rothbury, the Newcastle House, Turks Head and Queens Head pubs are all dog-friendly.

The butchers in the high street Rothbury have fantastic sausages and pies – give them a try!

We went to the Farne Islands to see the seals and sea birds, including puffins.

Hill walkers will enjoy the splendours of the nearby Simonside Hills.

The Dyke Neuk at Meldon is a lovely dog-friendly pub with excellent service and great food!

Definitely pay a visit to Hadrian's Wall, Belsay House, Wallington and Cragside.

Kielder Water & Forest Park is a wonderful day out for nature lovers, families, watersports enthusiasts and those looking to explore remote, stunning scenery.

Take a day out on the Aln Valley Railway, connecting Alnmouth to Alnwick.

Holy Island is home to lots of history and picturesque scenery – a must-see in Northumberland.

The site is close-by to the Wild Cattle of Chillingham, a lovely view!

Shopping

Rothbury, 6 miles, has a Co-op, local shops, cafés, pubs and takeaways. Morpeth, 12 miles, has a Morrisons, Lidl and M&S, and Alnwick has Sainsbury's, Morrisons and Aldi. At Scots Gap, there is a Robson and Cowan Country Store which sells everything except food.
