### 10 Newcastle Castle Keep

Newcastle Castle and Keep dates back to 1178 and is one of the finest examples of Norman stone in Britain. There's a wide-ranging event programme for all ages including guided tours, re-enactments, film screenings, theatre, and murder mystery plays.

A historic and picturesque village in Northumberland's Tyne Valley. Enjoy the historic pubs, riverside walks, shopping and explore the Roman Town.

### 8 Local routes

There are many public footpaths along the cliff top in both directions. Cycle or walk via the coastal path into Whitley Bay or Tynemouth with stunning open views and interesting sights to experience.

### 9 National Cycle Network

There are very good cycle tracks on the main road and in the local area.

The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is route number 1, Tynemouth to Berwick (Coast and Castle Cycle Route).



## Visitor's TOP TIPS

St Mary's Lighthouse is a short distance away. At certain times it is open to the public and you can usually spot seals basking on the rocks.

There is an excellent market at Tynemouth every weekend.

Nearby Delaval Arms public house serves a selection of food and fine ales and is also dog friendly.

Dog friendly beach 3/4 mile from the site at Seaton Sluice and on route via Collywell Bay Road, Castaways Cafe sells lovely homemade food.

The Kings Arms in Seaton Sluice is brilliant and is within easy walking distance from site.

Fabulous walk along to Whitley Bay along the cliff tops and beach.

There is a parkrun at 9am every Saturday on the seafront about a mile from the site.

Try the fish and chip shop at Seaton Sluice, it is magnificent and serves enormous portions!

Visit Longsands Beach in Tynemouth, Tynemouth Priory, Seaton Delaval Hall, Cragside, and the Farne Islands (we saw dolphins as well as seabirds on this trip).

## Close by

### Supermarkets

Co-op is 2.4 miles away.  
There is a Morrisons 3.3 miles away or a Londis 4.8 miles from site.

### Petrol Station

There is a BP 3.5 miles away and an Esso 6 mile from site.

### Cinema

Silverlink Retail Park, 5 miles from site.

### Swimming pool

Whitley Bay, 3 miles.

### Nearest Cashpoint

There is a cashpoint 2.4 miles away at the leisure park.

### Public transport

There is a bus stop only 5 minutes from site that runs every 10 minutes and serves all surrounding areas.
