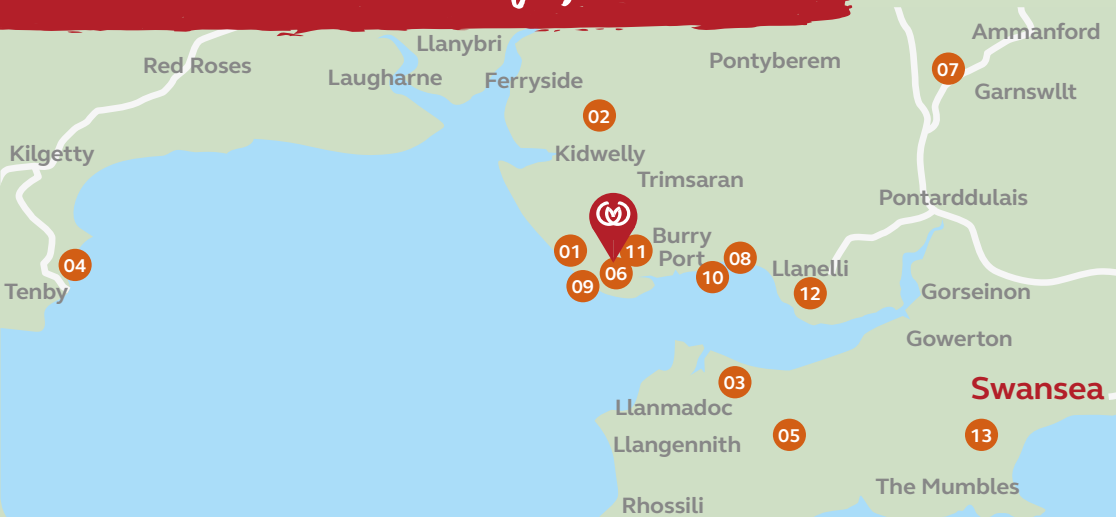

- 1 Pembrey Country Park**  
Set against the backdrop of the Gower Peninsular, and overlooking Carmarthen Bay, the park is a blend of coast and countryside.
- 2 Kidwelly Castle**  
Impressive remains of the castle established in the early twelfth century.
- 3 Gower Peninsular**  
Both beautiful and unspoilt with many historic features.
- 4 Tenby Harbour**  
A delightful harbour town and seaside resort.

## Walk

### 8 Celtic Trail

The 220 mile route runs across Wales from St David's to the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park, the magnificent Llanelli Millennium Coastal Park and the wide sweep of Swansea Bay.

### 9 Beach Walk

Pembrey Beach is a one mile walk through the park.

## Cycle

### 10 Millennium Coastal Path

20kms of traffic free cycling along the Celtic Trail. Routes 4 and 47 of the Sustrans network.

### 11 Cycling Notes

A cycle route from site has been developed in conjunction with Sustrans, please ask for a copy at Reception.

### 12 Llanelli

The largest town in the county, there are lots of museums, shops, eateries and historic sights to discover here.

### 13 Swansea & The Mumbles

This lovely coastal city has a gorgeous marina and promenade. If you head a little further north, you'll also find the historic Mumbles, home to spectacular scenery, quirky art galleries and independent boutiques.

*The historical walled town of Carmarthen has a local market on Wednesdays.*

*Pay a visit to Llanelli or Mumbles and treat yourself to Joe's Ice Cream.*

*Rugby fans, visit Parc y Scarlets to watch a match.*

*Enjoy the easy cycle ride along the coastal path, the views are stunning.*

*The National Botanical Gardens of Wales are around a 30-minute drive away, and is a wonderful day out with an amazing birds of prey display.*

*Kidwelly and Carmarthen castles are definitely worth a visit.*

*The Red Lion Pub in Pembrey served excellent food.*

*This location is ideal for dog owners, with plenty of gorgeous walks.*

*On weekday mornings, a milk man visits the site selling fresh orange juice, milk and newspapers, whilst the bread man sells buns, bread and cakes.*
