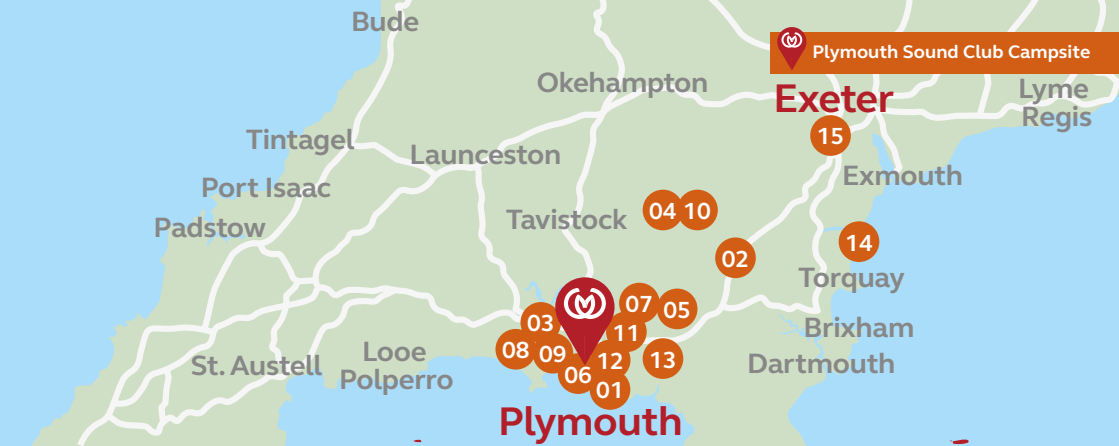

Visit

- 1 **Plymouth Sound**
Take a picturesque harbour cruise or ferries from the Barbican and see the historic dockyards or visit Cornwall for the day!
- 2 **South Devon Railway**
This seven mile line runs along the valley of the River Dart between Buckfastleigh and Totnes.
- 3 **National Marine Aquarium**
Visit the UK's largest Aquarium and be amazed by a fascinating underwater world.
- 4 **Dartmoor National Park**
The largest and wildest area of open country in Southern England.
- 5 **Saltram House**
Explore this decadent National Trust property and extensive grounds, set by the River Plym.

Plymouth's new museum, art gallery and cultural centre with immersive experiences and over 2 million artefacts.
- 7 **The Big Shoot**
Try your hand at clay pigeon shooting in a 1550 acre country estate.
- 8 **Royal William Yard**
Grade I listed ex-Naval victualling yard with the largest collection of used military buildings in Europe.

Visitor's top tips

I From Plymouth take a boat trip across the Tamar or to the smuggling village of Cawsand.

To go in to Plymouth drive to Mount Batten Pier, park for free and take the ferry to the Barbican.

If you're a bird and nature lover, take a walk round Wembury Point.

Great coastal path walks and café above Bovisands beach.

The nearby Mussel Inn serves excellent food and is very friendly.

We had a wonderful day out at Dartmoor Zoo, located just 15 minutes from Plymouth.

Salcome and Kings Bridge are both gorgeous areas to visit if you have time.

Our favourite National Trust properties include Saltram House, Buckland Abbey, Lydford Gorge and Cotehele.

If you're visiting in August, head to the Staddon Heights Golf Club to watch the fireworks – the views are fantastic. **I**
