

## Visit



### 1 Llanerchaeron

A rare example of a self sufficient 18th century estate, virtually unaltered.

### 2 Vale of Rheidol Railway

Journey through the spectacular Rheidol Valley by steam train.

### 3 The National Coracle Centre

A unique collection of the small ancient boats, set in a 17c flour mill by the salmon leap and falls.

### 4 Silver Mountain Experience

A 7 acre silver lead mine with museum, trails, underground tours, and gem panning.

### 5 Dolphin spotting

Take a boat trip from the picturesque town of New Quay, above the beautiful Cardigan bay, to see seals and dolphins.

### 6 Fishing

You can fish at the Nine Oaks pool, 400 yards from the site, as well as other fisheries in the area.

Ideal for golf lovers, there are four golf courses in the area including Cwmrhyduedd Golf Club.

Llangrannog is ideal for swimming and other water sports.

This is an excellent area for walking along the Heritage Coastal Paths.

Visit Bwlch Nant Y Arian Visitor Centre, a great place for walking and cycling and daily Red Kite feeding.

Take a walk along the disused railway track near to Llanerchaeron, following the Aeron River to Aberaeron.

Treat yourself to delicious fish and chips from The Lime Crab, New Quay or The New Celtic Restaurant, Aberaeron.

Visit Hive in Aberaeron for tasty honey ice cream.

If pub grub is your thing, then go to the Llanina Pub in Llanarth. We had two excellent evening meals, and also had Sunday lunch there. Absolutely superb.
