10 Truro


This picturesque city is a vibrant centre for shopping and culture, set in the heart of Cornwall.

11 St. Agnes

A little village nestled on the coast, set within both an Area of Outstanding Beauty and a World Heritage Site.

12 St. Ives

One of Cornwall's most famous destinations for its gorgeous scenery.



Make sure you try a famous Hedgehog cone from Chapel Porth beach cafe. Cornish ice cream, smothered in clotted cream and rolled in hazelnuts - yum!

Pick up the local footpath map to find the quick walks into town, over the fields, up and over the Beacon and along the coast.

Wander along the breath-taking coast and take in the wildlife at the National Trust's Chapel Porth, it's absolutely stunning.

We'd recommend the sausage rolls and florentines at St Agnes Bakery coffee shop.

The Driftwood Spars Pub offers great local beers and delicious homemade food. It's an easy 30-minute walk to St. Agnes, where you'll find lots of shops, eateries and pubs.

Visit in April for the The Bolster Festival with street entertainers, beer festival and sea shanties, finishing with a lantern procession to The Beacon behind the site.

The mobile food vans that visit site were excellent, especially the fish & chips.

Stroll along the beach in the evening and watch the sunset over the sea.

The St. Agnes Museum is a very interesting visit if you want to learn more about the area's rich mining a nd maritime history.
