

## Visit

- 1 Glengoyne Distillery**  
Distillery tours and whisky tastings. You can even create your own whisky to take home!
- 2 Amazonia Tropical Rainforest**  
Home to over 70 species including monkeys, snakes, butterflies and bats.
- 3 Bothwell Castle**  
One of Scotland's outstanding medieval monuments.

- 4 Celtic Park Stadium**  
The home of Celtic FC, with a capacity of 60,411.
- 5 Strathclyde Country Park Water Sports Centre**  
Try windsurfing, water skiing, rowing, pedalos or bumper boats.
- 6 Highland Fling Bungee**  
If a Bungee Jump is on your bucket list then Highland Fling have two locations, the Titan Crane towering 150ft above the River Clyde or the Killiecrankie Jump.
- 7 Cloudbusters Paragliding**  
A fun day to suit both beginners and those more experienced.

## Walk

### 8 Local Walks

The Loch is a ten minute walk from the site, with a thousand acres of mature woodlands, wetlands, wildlife refuges and neat open parkland to explore. Offering unique bird and nature watching, miles of walking and cycle routes, as well as a whole range of watersports and golf.

## Cycle

### 9 Local Cycling

There are several cycle routes locally, including The Greenlink. Cycle the Raith Route to Bothwell and Uddingston or follow the cycle path to Bellshill. You can also cycle through the country park to Hamilton.

### 10 National Cycle Network

Join the 12 mile cycle route up to Glasgow via Route 74 and 75 along the River Clyde.

# Visitor's top tips



Falkirk Wheel

*Follow the cycle path to Bellshill. From here regular trains to Glasgow and are a great way to get in and see the city.*

*The walk around the lake in the country park is beautiful, ideal if you have a dog.*

*Visit M&D's theme park, it has a huge range of rides, attractions, restaurants, indoor and outdoor activities.*

*Within an hour to the east you can see The Kelpies sculptures in Falkirk, also visit the Falkirk Wheel while you're in the area to make an excellent day out.*

*For a new route when cycling round the lake - turn off and go up to the house at Chatelherault.*

*Try a deep fried Mars bar in Glasgow!*

*The mountain bike trails at Cathkin Brae are a must, you are able to cycle the majority of the European Championship Course.*

*For archaeology buffs there is even a Roman Bath-house to visit in the park.*

*A visit to the Ayrshire coast is good for day trip.*

Co-Op Bothwell, 1.2 miles.

Hamilton Palace Towers, 2.5 miles.
